A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 82, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2007, established the state building code council to
- 3 adopt a uniform set of statewide building codes applicable to
- 4 one- and two-family dwellings and all other residential,
- 5 commercial, industrial, and state buildings to facilitate the
- 6 application of consistent standards by building owners,
- 7 designers, contractors, and code enforcers within the State.
- 8 The legislature recognizes that the jurisdiction of the
- 9 department of accounting and general services is limited to
- 10 state facilities. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to
- 11 administratively relocate the state building code council from
- 12 the department of accounting and general services to the Hawaii
- 13 state energy office.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending the definition of "department".
- 16 ""Department" means the department of [accounting and
- 17 general services.] business, economic development, and tourism."

1 SECTION 3. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 There is established a state building code council. 4 The council shall be placed within the [department of accounting 5 and general services] Hawaii state energy office for 6 administrative purposes only. The council shall consist of 7 eleven voting members and one nonvoting member, who shall be the comptroller or the comptroller's designee. The council members 8 9 shall serve four-year terms. The voting members shall include: 10 (1)One county building official from each of the four 11 counties appointed by the mayor; 12 (2) One member representing the state fire council; 13 (3) One member representing the department of labor and 14 industrial relations who has significant experience in 15 elevator safety: 16 One member representing the state energy office of the 17 department [of-business, economic development, and 18 tourism]; 19 (5) One member representing the Structural Engineers 20 Association of Hawaii;

1	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of
2		Architects, Hawaii State Council;
3	(7)	One member representing the Building Industry
4		Association of Hawaii or the General Contractors
5		Association of Hawaii, who has significant experience
6		with building codes, with alternating four-year terms
7		between the two organizations and the first four-year
8		term to be served by the Building Industry Association
9		of Hawaii; and
10	(8)	One member representing the Subcontractors'
11		Association of Hawaii who has significant experience
12		with building codes."
13	SECT	ION 4. Section 107-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
15	"(b)	The budgetary requirements for conducting meetings,
16	training,	travel, and other related responsibilities of the
17	council,	including salaries of the executive director, executive
18	assistant	, and other staff, shall be included in the budget of
19	the depar	tment [of accounting and general services]."
20	SECT	ION 5. All rights, powers, functions, and duties
21	relating	to the state building code council are transferred from

- 1 the department of accounting and general services to the Hawaii
- 2 state energy office.
- 3 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose
- 4 functions are transferred to the Hawaii state energy office by
- 5 this Act shall retain their civil service status, whether
- 6 permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without
- 7 loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable
- 8 collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior
- 9 service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously
- 10 earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, in
- 11 accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that
- 12 the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public
- 13 employment requirements for the class or position to which
- 14 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that
- 15 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable
- 16 civil service and compensation laws.
- Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil
- 18 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may
- 19 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed
- 20 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An
- 21 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer

- 1 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits
- 2 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 3 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 4 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 5 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 6 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 7 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of
- 8 business, economic development, and tourism may prescribe the
- 9 duties and qualifications of these employees and fix their
- 10 salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 11 SECTION 6. All rules, policies, procedures, guidelines,
- 12 and other material relating to the state building code council
- 13 that are adopted or developed by the department of business,
- 14 economic development, and tourism to implement provisions of the
- 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes that are reenacted or made applicable to
- 16 the Hawaii state energy office by this Act shall remain in full
- 17 force and effect until amended or repealed by the department of
- 18 business, economic development, and tourism pursuant to chapter
- 19 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every reference to
- 20 the department of accounting and general services or comptroller
- 21 in those rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and other

- 1 material is amended to refer to the department of business,
- 2 economic development, and tourism; director of business,
- 3 economic development, and tourism; or chief energy officer, as
- 4 appropriate.
- 5 SECTION 7. All deeds, leases, contracts, loans,
- 6 agreements, permits, or other documents relating to the state
- 7 building code council that are executed or entered into by or on
- 8 behalf of the department of accounting and general services,
- 9 pursuant to the provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, that
- 10 are reenacted or made applicable to the department of business,
- 11 economic development, and tourism by this Act shall remain in
- 12 full force and effect. Effective July 1, 2021, every reference
- 13 to the department of accounting and general services or the
- 14 comptroller in those deeds, leases, contracts, loans,
- 15 agreements, permits, or other documents shall be construed as a
- 16 reference to the department of business, economic development,
- 17 and tourism; the director of business, economic development, and
- 18 tourism; or the chief energy officer, as appropriate.
- 19 SECTION 8. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 20 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 21 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,

- 1 acquired, or held by the department of accounting and general
- 2 services relating to the functions of the state building code
- 3 council that are transferred to the department of business,
- 4 economic development, and tourism shall be transferred with the
- 5 functions to which they relate.
- 6 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
