
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-364, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
3 follows:
4 "~~{}~~\$11-364~~{}~~ **Excess contribution; return; escheat.** (a)
5 Any candidate, candidate committee, or noncandidate committee
6 that receives in the aggregate more than the applicable
7 contribution limit in section 11-357, 11-358, 11-359, or 11-360
8 shall return any excess contribution to the contributor within
9 thirty days of receipt of the excess contribution. Any
10 candidate, candidate committee, or noncandidate committee that
11 receives in the aggregate more than the applicable contribution
12 limit in section 11-362 shall return any excess contribution to
13 the contributor within thirty days of the end of the election
14 period; provided that the candidate, candidate committee, or
15 noncandidate committee may choose which contributions to return.
16 Any excess contribution not returned to the contributor within
17 thirty days shall escheat to the Hawaii election campaign fund."

3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Campaign Spending Commission Package; Contribution Limits;

Description:

Provides that excess contributions by nonresident contributors shall escheat to the Hawaii election campaign fund if not returned to the contributor within thirty days of the end of the election period. Allows the candidate, candidate committee, or noncandidate committee to choose which excess contributions by nonresident contributors to return. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1)
