A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1106.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 2 is amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§302A-1106.5 Board of education; community [meetings.]
- 4 forums. [The board shall hold not less than one community
- 5 meeting annually in each county in] In addition to their regular
- 6 meetings, the board shall hold no less than six community forums
- 7 annually to discuss and receive input from the community on
- 8 public education and public library issues [-]; provided that the
- 9 board shall hold at least one community forum in each county.
- 10 The board chairperson shall designate less than a quorum of
- 11 board members to attend [the] each community [meetings.] forum.
- 12 These community [meetings] forums shall not be held for the
- 13 purpose of formulating educational policy. The community
- 14 [meetings] forums shall be [exempt from sections 92-2.5, 92-7,
- 15 92-9, and 92-41; provided that the board shall give written
- 16 public notice of each community meeting. The meeting notice
- 17 shall indicate the date, time, and place of the meeting, and

1	shall be	filed in the office of the lieutenant governor and in	
2	the board's office for public inspection six calendar days		
3	before the meeting. The notice shall also be posted at the site		
4	of the meeting.] a permitted interaction under section 92-2.5;

13		the removal of any person or persons who wilfully	
14		disrupt a community forum to prevent and compromise	
15		the conduct of the community forum shall not be	
16		prohibited;	
17	(3)	The board shall afford all interested persons an	
18		opportunity to submit data, views, or arguments, in	
19		writing or in person, on any public education or	
20		public library issues at each community forum;	

ı	(4)	NO commitment relating to a vote on a matter is made	
2	<u> </u>	or sought at any community forum; and	
3	<u>(5)</u>	At the next duly noticed meeting of the board, the	
4	1	board members shall report their attendance and the	
5	Ī	matters presented and discussed at the community	
6	<u> </u>	forum."	
7	SECTION 2. At any public meeting properly noticed pursuant		
8	to chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the board of education		
9	shall include an open forum at the end of its meeting agenda to		
10	afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral		
11	testimony on any matter not on the agenda; provided that the		
12	testimony is related to matters over which the board of		
13	education has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory		
14	power.		
15	SECTIO	ON 3. The board of education shall report to the	
16	legislature	e no later than twenty days prior to the convening of	
17	the regular session of 2022 on its efforts to amend its policies		
18	to include an open forum at the end of its meeting agenda to		
19	afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral		
20	testimony o	on any matter not on the agenda.

- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.

Board of Education; Public Meetings; Oral Testimony; Community Forums

Description:

Requires the board of education to hold no less than six community forums annually, with at least one forum in each county. Requires the board to include an open forum for public comments on non-agenda items. Requires a report to the Legislature on implementing open forums. (SD1)
