## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the nursing facility
- 2 sustainability program was established in 2012 and has served a
- 3 critical role in strengthening the long-term care system in
- 4 Hawaii. In the nine years since its inception, the nursing
- 5 facility sustainability program has helped long-term care
- 6 facilities treat the most vulnerable patients in the State,
- 7 especially low-income individuals who require these services.
- 8 The program has been carried out via a public-private
- 9 partnership to ensure that patients in Hawaii can access
- 10 quality, affordable care.
- 11 The legislature further finds that, even with this program,
- 12 nursing facilities in the State face major challenges. These
- 13 challenges are due in part to the health and financial pressures
- 14 related to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic.
- 15 Medicaid is jointly financed by the federal and state
- 16 governments by statutory formula; the federal government pays
- 17 between fifty per cent and seventy-four per cent, with



- 1 assistance levels determined by each state's per capita income.
- 2 States with the lowest per capita income receive higher federal
- 3 matching rates. Under federal rules, the state share must be
- 4 public funds that are not federal funds. The legislature notes
- 5 that public funding to help sustain Hawaii's nursing facilities
- 6 financially may be accessed through a provider fee.
- 7 The legislature also finds that forty-nine states and the
- 8 District of Columbia use provider fees to draw down federal
- 9 funds to sustain their medicaid programs. The fees have been
- 10 employed due to rising state budget deficits, increasing health
- 11 care costs, and expanding medicaid enrollment. Provider fees,
- 12 which are collected from specific categories of health care
- 13 providers, may be imposed on different classes of health care
- 14 services, including inpatient and outpatient hospital and
- 15 nursing facility services.
- 16 The legislature therefore finds that, in Hawaii, a provider
- 17 fee on nursing facilities can result in a substantial increase
- 18 in medicaid payments, without putting additional constraints on
- 19 the State's budget. The additional federal funds obtained via
- 20 the fee program authorized by the nursing facility
- 21 sustainability program can maintain access to care for medicaid

- 1 recipients, which will allow nursing facilities in the State to
- 2 continue to serve under-insured or uninsured patients in a
- 3 timely, effective matter and help ensure the overall
- 4 sustainability of the health care system in the State during the
- 5 challenging time of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to preserve access to health
- 7 care for medicaid recipients by extending the nursing facility
- 8 sustainability program.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 346F-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- "(c) Revenue from the nursing facility sustainability fee
- 12 shall be used exclusively as follows:
- 13 (1) No less than eighty-eight per cent of the revenue from
- 14 the nursing facility sustainability fee shall be used
- for one or more of the following[+] purposes:
- 16 (A) To match federal medicaid funds, with the
- 17 combined total to be used to enhance capitated
- 18 rates to medicaid managed care health plans for
- the purpose of increasing medicaid payments to
- 20 private nursing facilities to support the
- 21 availability of services and ensure access to

- 6 facility shall pay in twelve equal installments the nursing
- 7 facility sustainability fee in section 346F-5 on a monthly
- 8 basis, subject to the terms of this section. The fee shall be
- 9 due within [thirty] sixty days after the end of each month, with
- 10 the initial payment due on the later of July 31, 2012, or forty-
- 11 five days after the required federal approvals for the
- 12 assessment and any increase in health plan capitation payments
- 13 have been secured from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
- 14 Services."
- 15 SECTION 5. Section 346F-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§346F-10 Enhanced rates to medicaid managed care health
- 18 plans. In accordance with title 42 Code of Federal Regulations
- 19 part 438, the department shall use revenues from the nursing
- 20 facility sustainability fee and federal matching funds to
- 21 enhance the capitated rates paid to medicaid managed care health

- 1 plans for [state fiscal years 2019 2020 and 2020 2021,] the

#### Report Title:

Nursing Facility Sustainability Program; Special Fund; Department of Human Services; Appropriation

### Description:

Extends the nursing facility sustainability program to 2024. Specifies that the nursing facility sustainability fee limit is 5.5 per cent of overall net patient service revenue. Removes the per resident daily maximum fee of \$20 for each facility. Specifies facilities that meet certain exceptions shall pay a reduced daily fee in comparison to other participating facilities. Allows nursing facilities to pay assessed fees within 60 days, instead of 30 days. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
