# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require:  
2 (1) The department of health to disseminate information  
3 regarding seizure first aid; and  
4 (2) Employers to post materials provided by the department  
5 of health to educate employees with respect to seizure  
6 first aid.

7 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated  
9 and to read as follows:

10 "§321- Seizure first aid; information. (a) The  
11 department of health shall provide employers, employees, and the  
12 general public with information with respect to rendering  
13 seizure first aid. The information shall be disseminated  
14 through exhibitions, broadcasts, lectures, posters, flyers,  
15 pamphlets, or any other method of disseminating information.



1       (b) All employers shall post information on seizure first  
2 aid provided by the department of health in a prominent position  
3 in the employer's workplace.

4       (c) The department of health shall adopt rules in  
5 accordance with chapter 91 to implement this section.

6       (d) For the purposes of this section, "seizure first aid"  
7 means procedures to respond, attend, and provide comfort and  
8 safety to a person suffering from a primary generalized tonic-  
9 clonic seizure or complex partial seizure. The term does not  
10 include training to medically treat a person suffering a  
11 seizure."

12       SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

13       SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
