# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that animals were

2 historically hunted and trapped for food, and their pelts were

3 used to provide protective clothing. Over time, clothing

4 technology has developed, making fur a luxury item, rather than

5 a necessity. Fur garments are typically designed for fashion

6 rather than for warmth, and more animals are now killed to make

7 decorative fur trim than to manufacture full fur garments. Due

8 to serious animal welfare concerns, more and more countries are

9 phasing out fur farming and enacting fur farming bans.

10 The legislature recognizes that more than one hundred

11 million animals are violently killed every year solely for their

12 fur. More than eighty-five per cent of pelts in the world's fur

13 trade come from fur farms, while the remaining fifteen per cent

14 of pelts are from animals trapped in the wild. The legislature

15 finds that, especially considering the wide array of faux fur

16 and other fashion and apparel alternatives, the demand for fur

17 products does not justify the cruel treatment and unnecessary

- 1 killing of animals. Eliminating the sale of fur products in
- 2 Hawaii will foster a more humane environment in the State.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the fur trade poses
- 4 serious human health and animal welfare concerns. Recent
- 5 reports from mink fur farms abroad have revealed dangerous links
- 6 between the industry and the further spread of the SARS-CoV-2
- 7 virus to humans from animals. Additionally, mink, raccoon,
- 8 dogs, and foxes that are commonly farmed for their fur have been
- 9 linked to a variety of coronaviruses.
- 10 The legislature further finds that fur farming can be
- 11 damaging to the environment and contributes to water and air
- 12 pollution in multiple ways. Fur farming often involves the use
- 13 of toxic chemicals, including chromium and formaldehyde, which
- 14 can seep into ground water and other water sources. For each
- 15 kilogram of factory-farmed mink fur produced, one hundred ten
- 16 kilograms of carbon dioxide are released into the atmosphere.
- 17 Fur farming also consumes significant quantities of energy and
- 18 water; producing a real fur garment uses more than fifteen times
- 19 the energy needed to produce a faux fur garment.
- The legislature acknowledges that existing laws provide
- 21 relatively little oversight of the fur trade industries.

- 1 Compliance with guidelines issued by the American Veterinary
- 2 Medical Association is not mandatory, and fur farms are not
- 3 monitored or inspected by any government agency. Federal laws
- 4 prohibit the import or export of dog or cat fur products into
- 5 the United States, prohibit the introduction of dog and cat fur
- 6 products into interstate commerce, forbid deceptive labeling of
- 7 fur products, and require products made with real fur to be
- 8 properly labeled. Imposition of such requirements for other
- 9 types of animal fur products would allow Hawaii consumers to
- 10 choose whether to purchase real or faux fur garments.
- 11 As human, animal, and ecosystem health are inextricably
- 12 linked, it is vital for our health, economy, and security that
- 13 Hawaii, the United States, and countries across the globe shut
- 14 down the cruel, risky, and unpopular fur farming industry and
- 15 end the fur trade by banning fur sales. Accordingly, the
- 16 purpose of this Act is to:
- 17 (1) Beginning July 1, 2021, prohibit the manufacture for
- sale and importation of certain animal fur products in
- 19 the State; and
- 20 (2) Beginning December 1, 2021, prohibit the sale, offer
- 21 for sale, display for sale, trade, or otherwise

1	distribute for monetary or nonmonetary consideration,
2	certain fur products in the State.
3	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
4	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
5	as follows:
6	"CHAPTER
7	ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS
8	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
9	"Director" means the director of agriculture.
10	"Fur" means any animal skin with hair, fleece, or fur
11	fibers attached, either in its raw or processed state, including
12	mink and other non-native species.
13	"Fur product" means any article of clothing or covering for
14	any part of the body, or any fashion accessory, including but
15	not limited to handbags, shoes, slippers, hats, earmuffs,
16	scarves, shawls, gloves, jewelry, keychains, toys or trinkets,
17	or home accessories and decor that is made in whole or in part
18	of fur; provided that "fur product" does not include any of the
19	following:
20	(1) A dog or cat fur product, as defined in title 19
21	United States Code section 1308;

- 1 (2) An animal skin that is to be converted into leather,
  2 or which in processing will have the hair, fleece, or
  3 fur fiber completely removed;
- 4 (3) Cowhide with the hair attached;
- (4) Goatskin, lambskin, or sheepskin with the fleeceattached; or
- (5) The pelt or skin of any animal that is preserved8 through taxidermy or for the purposes of taxidermy.
- 9 "Nonprofit organization" means any entity organized under 10 title 26 United States Code section 501(c)(3) for charitable,

religious, philanthropic, educational, or similar purposes.

- "Taxidermy" means the practice of preparing and preserving
  the skin of an animal that is deceased and stuffing and mounting
  it in lifelike form.
- "Ultimate consumer" means an individual who buys a fur

  16 product for the individual's own use, or for the use of another,

  17 but not for resale or trade.
- "Used fur product" means a fur product that has been worn
  or used by an ultimate consumer.
- 20 § -2 Manufacture and importation of fur products for 21 sale prohibited; exemption. (a) Beginning July 1, 2021, it

- 1 shall be unlawful to manufacture fur products in the State, or
- 2 import fur products into the State, for the purpose of sale.
- 3 (b) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply to
- 4 the manufacture for sale of fur products using fur sourced
- 5 exclusively from used fur products.
- 6 § -3 Sale of fur products prohibited; exemption. (a)
- 7 Beginning December 1, 2021, it shall be unlawful to sell, offer
- 8 for sale, display for sale, trade, or otherwise distribute for
- 9 monetary or nonmonetary consideration, a fur product in the
- 10 State.
- 11 (b) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply to
- 12 the sale, offer for sale, display for sale, trade, or other
- 13 distribution of:
- 14 (1) A used fur product by a private party, excluding a
- retail transaction, or a nonprofit organization, or
- secondhand store, including a pawn shop;
- 17 (2) A fur product required for use in the practice of a
- 18 religion;
- 19 (3) A fur product used for traditional cultural, tribal,
- or spiritual purposes by a member of a federally
- 21 recognized Native American tribe; or

- (4) A fur product where the activity is expressly
   authorized by federal law.
- 3 (c) For the purposes of this section, a sale shall be
- 4 deemed to occur at the location where the buyer takes physical
- 5 possession of the fur product.
- 6 § -4 Penalties; citations; administrative fines. (a)
- 7 Any person who violates this chapter or any rule adopted
- 8 pursuant to this chapter shall be subject to the fines as
- 9 provided in this section.
- (b) Each individual fur product manufactured for sale,
- 11 sold, offered for sale, displayed for sale, traded, or otherwise
- 12 distributed in violation of section -1 or -2 shall
- 13 constitute a separate violation of this chapter. Each day that
- 14 a violation exists, is continued, or continues to exist, shall
- 15 be construed as a separate offense.
- 16 (c) The director shall issue a warning notice to a person
- 17 for the person's violation of this chapter. The person shall
- 18 remedy the violation within twenty-four hours of receipt of the
- 19 warning notice or be subject to the penalties provided by this
- 20 section or rules adopted pursuant to this section.

- 1 (d) A person who receives a warning notice from the
- 2 director and who fails to remedy the violation in the time
- 3 specified under subsection (c) shall be fined not more than:
- 4 (1) \$500 for a first violation;
- 5 (2) \$750 for a second violation within one year of the
- 6 first violation; and
- 7 (3) \$1,000 for a third or subsequent violation within one
- **8** year of the previous violation.
- 9 § -5 Rules; informational and educational documents for
- 10 retail merchants. (a) The director shall adopt rules pursuant
- 11 to chapter 91 as necessary to carry out the purposes of this
- 12 chapter.
- 13 (b) Prior to December 1, 2021, the director, the
- 14 department of commerce and consumer affairs, and the department
- 15 of the attorney general shall collaborate to develop and
- 16 disseminate informational documents to educate and inform retail
- 17 merchants and suppliers of the provisions of this chapter."
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 20 begun before its effective date.

- 1 SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 2 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 3 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 4 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 5 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 6 of this Act are severable.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs; Animal Fur Products; Manufacture and Sale; Prohibition

## Description:

Beginning July 1, 2021, prohibits the manufacture for sale or importation of certain animal fur products in the State. Beginning December 1, 2021, prohibits the offer for sale, display for sale, or sale of certain animal fur products in the State. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
