SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES DIVISION TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF CHANGING ITS ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR THE HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES MEDICAID WAIVER FOR INDIVIDUALS HAVING INTELLECTUAL OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, OR MENTAL ILLNESSES.

WHEREAS, Hawaii residents having intellectual and 1 developmental disabilities who are eligible for services from 2 the Department of Health Developmental Disabilities Division are 3 eligible for Medicaid, and if they meet the level of care 4 5 criteria, they may apply for the Medicaid Section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services Waiver for Individuals with 6 7 Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, otherwise known as the Medicaid I/DD Waiver; and 8

10 WHEREAS, the Med-QUEST Division of the Department of Human 11 Services works in partnership with the Department of Health 12 Developmental Disabilities Division and stakeholders to design 13 an appropriate waiver that meets the needs of individuals who 14 have intellectual and developmental disabilities; and 15

16 WHEREAS, both divisions ensure that the waiver is 17 implemented in compliance with all waiver requirements, federal 18 and state laws, and waiver standards; and 19

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 11-88.1-5(a), Hawaii 20 Administrative Rules, to be considered as having an 21 developmental disability, an individual must have, among other 22 factors, a diagnosis that meets the definition of an eligible 23 condition for a severe and chronic disability, including 24 cerebral palsy; epilepsy; autism spectrum disorder; or a 25 neurological condition, central nervous system disorder, or 26 chromosomal disorder that results in impairment in both general 27 intellectual functioning and adaptive behavior; and 28



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1 2 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 11-88.1-5(a)(3), Hawaii Administrative Rules, an individual is ineligible for the 3 Medicaid I/DD Waiver if the individual's impairments are 4 5 primarily from dementia, mental illness, an emotional disorder, substance abuse, sensory impairment, a learning disability, 6 7 attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, a spinal cord injury, 8 or a neuromuscular disorder; and 9 10 WHEREAS, section 11-88.1-5(a)(3), Hawaii Administrative 11 Rules, unfairly excludes from eligibility from services a number of individuals who would otherwise be eligible based on their 12 13 developmental disabilities; and 14 WHEREAS, the Department of Health may amend or repeal 15 administrative rules under its purview, unless otherwise 16 prohibited by federal or state laws or agreements with federal 17 18 authorities; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 22 23 Health Developmental Disabilities Division is requested convene a task force to determine the feasibility of changing its 24 eligibility criteria for the Home and Community-Based Services 25 26 Medicaid Waiver for Individuals with Developmental Disabilities; 27 and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force membership is 30 requested to include the following members: 31 The Director of Health, or the Director's designee, 32 (1) who is requested to serve as chairperson of the task 33 force; 34 35 (2) The Director of Human Services, or the Director's 36 37 designee; 38 (3) The Attorney General, or the Attorney General's 39 40 designee; and 41



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1 (4) Any other members that the Director of Health chooses 2 to designate; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 5 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 6 7 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 8 2022; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, 11 Administrator of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, 12 Director of Human Services, and Attorney General. 13
