SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT OF PROPOSED MANDATORY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has long been a leader in advancing 2 reproductive rights, advocating the importance of access to reproductive health care without discrimination, and 3 implementing forward-thinking reproductive health care policy; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii's benefits and protections have been 8 threatened for four years by a hostile federal administration 9 that has attempted to restrict and repeal the federal Patient 10 Protection and Affordable Care Act and limit access to sexual 11 and reproductive health care benefits and protections; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Trump administration has made it increasingly difficult for insurers to cover abortion care and has assembled 14 a Supreme Court that may restrict abortion access and eliminate 15 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in the near 16 future; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has cost thousands of Hawaii residents their jobs and health insurance, making it critical 20 for the State to support struggling families by ensuring 21 22 preventative care and limiting out-of-pocket costs; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the safeguarding of access to abortion, the solidification of the essential health benefits that have 25 changed thousands of lives, and the improvement to overall 26 access to care requires the preservation of certain important 27 aspects of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and 28 29 the expansion of access to care for residents of Hawaii; and 30



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WHEREAS, H.B. No. , introduced during the Regular 1 Session of 2021, requires health insurers, mutual benefit 2 societies, and health maintenance organizations to provide 3 4 coverage without cost-sharing for a comprehensive category of 5 reproductive health services, drugs, devices, products, and procedures and also prohibits discrimination in the provision of 6 7 reproductive health care services; and 8 9 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 10 that before any legislative measure that mandates health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 11 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 12 of individual or group health insurance policies can be 13 considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed 14 requesting the Auditor to prepare and submit to the Legislature 15 a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of 16 the proposed mandatory coverage, and H.B. No. (2021) is such 17 a measure; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 22 23 requested to conduct a social and financial assessment of the mandatory health insurance coverage proposed under H.B. No. 24 which was introduced during the Regular Session of 2021; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of the Auditor's findings and recommendations, 28 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later 29 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 30 31 of 2022; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, Director of 34 Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and Insurance Commissioner. 35 36 37 OFFERED BY: Rosaly H Bik 38
