## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CREATE A LANDSCAPE MANAGEMENT PLAN WITH GOALS TO INCREASE TREE CANOPIES ON PUBLIC SCHOOL GROUNDS, DOCUMENT EXISTING INVENTORY AND TALENT, AND IDENTIFY ADDITIONAL RESOURCES REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT AND SUSTAIN THE PLAN.

WHEREAS, the average temperature in Hawaii has increased 1 2 over two degrees since 1950; and 3 WHEREAS, the increase in hot days makes it difficult for 4 students to learn at school; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, as a result, the Department of Education has responded with a heat abatement plan, and the State has invested 8 in air conditioning for over one thousand three hundred 9 classrooms; and 10 11 WHEREAS, school grounds enhance student learning and 12 success, as they offer a venue for play, outdoor learning, and 13 social gatherings; and 14 15 WHEREAS, on very hot days, these activities become 16 uncomfortable and even unsafe; and 17 18 WHEREAS, trees lower temperatures through shade, 19 transpiration, and reduction of the heat island effect; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, increasing the tree canopy on school grounds will enable students to continue to play, learn, and gather outside, 23 24 even as the temperature rises; and 25 WHEREAS, trees on school campuses will also absorb storm 26 27 water, clean the air, beautify campuses, and help reach county and state environmental goals; and 28

WHEREAS, an abundance of trees on school campuses would 1 help cool each campus and provide a multitude of learning 2 opportunities, including learning the role trees play in the 3 overall health of the ecosystem, cultural uses of indigenous 4 trees, tree propagation and care, commercial uses of trees, and 5 6 participation in community programs that promote tree planting; 7 and 8 WHEREAS, currently, there are fragmented initiatives to 9 plant trees on different campuses; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, increasing the tree canopy on school grounds statewide requires the creation of tools by the Department of 13 Education to guide tree selection, placement, and care; and 14 15 WHEREAS, one tool needed is a Tree Manual with current 16 arboricultural principals and industry standards; and 17 18 WHEREAS, another tool needed is a landscape management plan 19 that would help set, meet statewide timelines and deliverables, 20 and be updated every five years; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 25 Education is requested to create a landscape management plan 26 with goals to increase tree canopies on public school grounds, 27 document existing inventory and talent, and identify additional 28 resources required to implement and sustain the plan; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 32 Education and Chairperson of the Board of Education. 33 34 35 "an 36 OFFERED BY:
