SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING APRIL AS TREE AWARENESS MONTH IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 2	WHEREAS, trees have been identified as an important tool to combat global climate change, reduce society's carbon footprint,
3 4	and help communities become healthier; and
5	WHEREAS, trees, commonly described as the lungs of the
6	Earth, contribute to the environment by cleaning the air,
7 8	removing odors and pollutant gases, filtering particulates, and removing and storing carbon while releasing oxygen back into the
9	air; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, trees cool heat-absorbing streets and buildings by
12	up to ten degrees Fahrenheit by releasing water vapor into the
13 14	air through their leaves, which encourages residents to enjoy the outdoors, thereby improving their health, and contributes to
14	more vital communities; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, studies show that trees in urban areas also
18	encourage residents to spend more time outdoors under the canopy
19 20	of trees where they can immerse themselves in a forest-like
20 21	environment and soak in the atmosphere through their senses to achieve a feeling of rejuvenation; and
22	achieve a recrimy or rejuvenacion, and
23	WHEREAS, trees reduce UV-B exposure by almost fifty percent
24	and provide protection to children from exposure to ultraviolet
25	rays on school campuses and playgrounds where they spend hours
26 27	outdoors; and
28	WHEREAS, well-documented studies confirm the positive
29	effects of trees on people's health and productivity, such as
30	faster recovery times from surgery, lower blood pressure levels,
31	higher performance and productivity for those with views of
32	trees outside of their offices, and higher test scores and

graduation rates for students with trees outside their school 1 windows, as trees have been found to aid in concentration by 2 reducing mental fatigue; and 3 4 WHEREAS, trees in our island state are a crucial part of 5 sustainable living and agricultural economy and harvesting 6 agricultural products, such as fruit and wood, helps create 7 green jobs for our residents and greater opportunities for small 8 9 businesses; and 10 WHEREAS, in our tourism-based economy, trees and 11 landscaping contribute to the beauty of our urban areas and 12 create a welcoming environment that attracts tourists, thereby 13 increasing the flow of business to those areas; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture 16 reported that street trees increase property values and that 17 planting large trees along streets, sidewalks, and parking lots 18 also help absorb heat, energy, and dust; mask concrete walls and 19 unsightly views; muffle sounds from freeways; create an eye-20 soothing canopy of green; and foster civic pride within 21 neighborhoods; and 22 23 WHEREAS, state and community organizations have endeavored 24 25 to foster knowledge and awareness of trees, and collectively have declared that "trees literally hold our island state 26 27 together, helping define our island sense of place, that special connection between our diverse cultures and the environment, the 28 29 land and its people"; and 30 WHEREAS, according to Dr. Camilo Mora of Mora Lab of the 31 32 Geography and Environment Department at the University of Hawaii who heads the Carbon Neutrality Project, Arbor Day is but one 33 day to help raise awareness of trees and that designating the 34 35 entire month of April as Tree Awareness Month would raise greater awareness and adequately recognize the multitude of 36 benefits and importance trees have, particularly in an island 37 state that depends heavily upon sustainability and tourism; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, the public should be encouraged to learn more about the value of trees and designating April as Tree Awareness 41 Month would be an appropriate way to honor trees while also 42

providing community building and educational and economic 1 opportunities through planned events; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 4 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that April be designated as 6 7 Tree Awareness Month in the State of Hawaii; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of Board of Land and Natural Resources, and mayors 11 of all counties. 12
