SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS AND THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD TO ENSURE THAT THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD INCLUDES AT LEAST TWO MEMBERS WITH EXPERTISE IN SPECIALTY STRUCTURAL CONTRACTING.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that construction industry 1 review boards, such as the Contractors License Board, are 2 necessary to protect the welfare and safety of the general 3 4 public; and 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature has also established, for example, 6 the special Board of Electricians and Plumbers to ensure that 7 the licensure for these specialized trades are reviewed and 8 9 administered appropriately; and 10 11 WHEREAS, a General Engineering Contractor or General Building Contractor must ensure that the subcontractors and 12 workers assigned to install and erect specialized steel 13 structures, like those performing welding services, have 14 sufficient knowledge and experience to maintain a safe work 15 environment and make certain the installation and construction 16 17 of the specialized structure is done properly; and 18 19 WHEREAS, General Engineering Contractor licenses and General Building Contractor licenses issued by the Contractors 20 License Board automatically hold a number of specialty 21 22 classifications without requiring further examination or payment of additional fees, a number of which may greatly influence the 23 structural integrity of a building, namely: 24 25 (1) C-6 Carpentry Framing; 26 27 (2) C-31 Masonry; 28 29 (3) C-32 Ornamental, Guardrail, and Fencing; 30

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structural contracting subclassifications listed above; provided 1 2 that the license was not issued automatically as a result of 3 holding a General Engineering Contractor license or a General 4 Building Contractor license; and 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 7 Consumer Affairs in conjunction with the Contractors License Board is requested to consider: 8 9 (1) The feasibility of establishing an advisory committee 10 11 focused on structural contracting issues within the existing Board composition to enhance sensitivity and 12 13 attention given to structural contracting issues; 14 Whether the Contractors License Board's current (2) 15 administrative rules that allow for the automatic 16 issuance of certain specialty licenses enumerated 17 above for General Engineering Contractors and General 18 Building Contractors, without further examination or 19 fees, are prudent and sufficiently ensure the safety 20 and welfare of the public; and 21 22 Consulting with relevant stakeholders, including 23 (3) construction companies and unions, contractors, Hawaii 24 25 Building and Construction Trades Council, Board of Electricians and Plumbers, and Structural Engineers 26 27 Association of Hawaii to determine whether the 28 Contractors License Board's licensing practices with 29 respect to structural contracting are sufficient to ensure the safety and welfare of the public; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 32 Consumer Affairs in conjunction with the Contractors License 33 Board is requested to submit a report on their findings, 34 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 35 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 36 of 2022; and 37 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce 40

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and Consumer Affairs and Chairperson of the Contractors License
Board.
