SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING ANY PUBLIC PROJECT, PERMIT, OR APPROVAL THAT IMPROVES PEDESTRIAN AND TRAFFIC SAFETY WHILE RETAINING PUBLIC PARKING AT LANIAKEA BEACH.

WHEREAS, Kamehameha Highway at Laniakea Beach has been, and 1 continues to be, a traffic choke point with pedestrians crossing 2 3 from the parking area to the beach that causes traffic to regularly back up as much as two miles in both directions; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, community members have actively advocated for relief from the traffic congestion and disorganized beach access 7 since at least 2005 and there have been several opportunities 8 for the State and City and County of Honolulu to work together 9 with stakeholders to resolve the parking and safety concerns; 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, to ensure that the public would continue to park 13 mauka of the highway at Laniakea Beach, the City and County of 14 Honolulu used eminent domain and obtained possession of the site 15 of Laniakea Beach Support Park by a court order on August 2, 16 1999; and 17 18 WHEREAS, on December 23, 2013, the Department of 19 Transportation placed concrete jersey barriers on the mauka 20 shoulder of the highway to block the public from parking on city 21 property mauka of Laniakea Beach; and 22 23 WHEREAS, a lawsuit was filed to restore parking for beach 24 25 access and on July 8, 2015, the First Circuit Court ruled that the plaintiffs are likely to prevail upon the merits of the 26 27 dispute regarding whether the Department of Transportation can maintain the traffic barriers on the park area without the 28 necessary permits and issued a preliminary injunction which 29 required the Department of Transportation to remove all jersey 30 31 barriers from the park area; and 32

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2015, the Department of 1 2 Transportation removed the jersey barriers from the highway and placed them at the back of the parking area, and then removed 3 them entirely from city property by September 27, 2019; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation is presently 6 7 considering four alternatives: No Build Alternative, No Build Settlement Alternative, Transportation System Management 8 Alternative, and Pedestrian Shift Alternative; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the No Build Alternative leaves the project area 11 12 as is; and 13 WHEREAS, the No Build Settlement Alternative would 14 implement the project stipulated in the settlement reached 15 between the City and County of Honolulu, Department of 16 Transportation, and the litigants; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the Transportation System Management Alternative would block parking on the mauka side of Kamehameha Highway with 20 a permanent quardrail, similar to what was done with jersey 21 22 barriers; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Pedestrian Shift Alternative would realign Kamehameha Highway and allow parking between the highway and the 25 26 shoreline, but proposes to prohibit parking for an undetermined 27 time, possibly years, during construction; and 28 29 WHEREAS, any agency permit or approval which allows closing 30 most or all public parking at Laniakea Beach for a multi-year period would not comply with state coastal zone management 31 policies and would unreasonably restrict beneficial use of the 32 33 environment and public resources and other community cultural 34 practices; now, therefore, 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 36 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 37 House of Representatives concurring, that this body supports any 38 public project, permit, or approval that improves pedestrian and 39 40 traffic safety while retaining public parking at Laniakea Beach; 41 and 42

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body opposes any public project, permit, or approval which would close most or all public parking at Laniakea Beach for a multi-year period; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 6 7 of Transportation, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Chairperson 8 9 of the Honolulu City Council, Director of Parks and Recreation of the City and County of Honolulu, Director of Design and 10 Construction of the City and County of Honolulu, and Director of 11 12 Planning and Permitting of the City and County of Honolulu.
