SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO FORM A SPECIAL COMMITTEE OR PERMITTED INTERACTION GROUP TO MONITOR AND ACCOUNT FOR HOW THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IS SPENDING ITS FEDERAL RELIEF FUNDS.

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security
 (CARES) Act, Public Law 116-136, created the Education
 Stabilization Fund to provide emergency funding for education
 systems, and within that fund is the Elementary and Secondary
 School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund, which awards moneys to
 states based on their relative share of Elementary and Secondary
 Act (ESEA) grants for fiscal year 2019; and

9 WHEREAS, allowable uses for ESSER funds include the coordination of preparedness and response efforts with state and 10 local public health departments; providing principals with 11 resources necessary to address needs of individual schools; 12 address needs of low-income children, children with 13 disabilities, English learners, racial and ethnic minorities and 14 students experiencing homelessness and foster care youth; 15 including how outreach and service delivery will meet the needs 16 of each population; purchasing educational technology for 17 students, including low-income students and students with 18 19 disabilities; providing mental health services and support; planning and implementing activities related to summer learning 20 21 and supplemental after-school programs, including online instruction; and the maintenance of continuity of services and 22 23 the continued employment of existing staff; and 24

WHEREAS, in May 2020, the Department of Education applied
for Hawaii's share of relief funds from the United States
Department of Education and received \$43,385,229; and

WHEREAS, on December 21, 2020, Congress passed the
Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations
(CRRSA) Act, Public Law 116-260, 2021, which authorized



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\$900,000,000,000 in stimulus relief through various programs and 1 a \$1,400,000,000,000 omnibus spending; and 2 3 WHEREAS, states that received certain federal funds, 4 including moneys from the ESSER Fund established by the CARES 5 ACT and the CRRSA Act, are required to assure that they will 6 7 maintain support for education programs; and 8 WHEREAS, on January 5, 2021, the Department of Education 9 received notification from the United States Department of 10 Education that the allocation of ESSER II funds is \$183,595,211, 11 12 which are available for expenditure through September 30, 2023; 13 and 14 WHEREAS, expanded allowable uses for ESSER II funds include 15 addressing learning loss; preparing schools for reopening; and 16 testing, repairing, and upgrading projects to improve air 17 quality in school buildings; and 18 19 WHEREAS, under the CRRSA Act, any state that receives ESSER 20 II funds "shall to the greatest extent practicable, continue to 21 pay its employees and contractors during the period of any 22 23 disruptions or closures related to the coronavirus" and "shall provide assurances that such State will maintain support for 24 elementary and secondary education ... in fiscal year 2022 at 25 least at the proportional levels of such State's support for 26 elementary and secondary education ... relative to such State's 27 overall spending, averaged over fiscal years 2017, 2018, and 28 29 2019"; and 30 WHEREAS, on February 18, 2021, the Department of Education 31 recommended that these limited federal funds be used in Fiscal 32 Year 2020-21 and 2021-22 for: 33 34 Public charter schools' pro-rata share of the award 35 (1)(\$9,000,000);36 37 (2) Current fiscal year 2020-21 shortfalls (\$79,400,000); 38 39 **4**0

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(3) Off-setting a portion of the \$41,100,000 Program 1 Review Reduction for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to restore 2 cuts to the general fund budget that remain assigned 3 4 at the program level (\$82,100,000); 5 (4) Learning loss mitigation strategies (\$65,700,000); and 6 7 8 (5) Health and safety measures (\$15,00,000); and 9 WHEREAS, there are ongoing concerns with how the Department 10 of Education has been utilizing these ESSER funds, and there 11 12 have been disagreements between the Board of Education and 13 Department of Education on how ESSER II funds should be spent; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, although the Department of Education has reported 16 its use of ESSER I funds on a monthly basis, there has been a 17 lack of transparency and accountability in how the Department of 18 Education and their schools have utilized their funds to service 19 students; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 22 23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Education 24 is urged to form a special committee or permitted interaction 25 26 group to monitor and account for how the Department of Education is spending its federal relief funds; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special committee or permitted interaction group should meet twice a month to ensure 30 that the Board of Education and the public can receive timely 31 updates on the Department of Education expenditures of funds 32 until all federal funds are expended; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special committee or 35 permitted interaction group is requested to submit a preliminary 36 37 report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of Regular Session 38 of 2022, and a final report no later than twenty days prior to 39 the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 40 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
 Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education.

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
