SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO COMPILE A SHORT LIST OF FORTUNE 500 COMPANIES THAT ARE SUITABLE TO RELOCATE TO HAWAII AND IDENTIFY MEANS AND INCENTIVES TO ENTICE THESE COMPANIES TO RELOCATE.

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| 3 4 5 | WHEREAS, the economy of the State is largely dependent on the tourism industry; and | | |
| 6 7 8 | WHEREAS, the effects of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic and resulting job losses in the tourism | | |
| 9 10 | sector of the economy have demonstrated the urgent need for business diversification in the State; and | | |
| 11 12 | WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has shown that many jobs and | | |

| 15 16 17 | WHEREAS, business leaders must consider economic development opportunities, business climate, tax friendliness, | | |

| 20 21 22 | WHEREAS, the State consistently ranks among the top states in the country for clean air quality, happiness of its citizens, | | |
| 23 24 | life expectancy, good weather, and overall quality of life; and | | |
| 25 26 27 | WHEREAS, given the advances in technology and the way business is conducted in the modern age, there are more reasons for a company to relocate to Hawaii than ever before; and | | |
| 28 29 | WHEREAS, some incentives that other states have used to | | |
| 30 31 | entice companies to relocate are: | | |

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- (1) Indiana offers a credit against corporate income tax 1 liability where the credit can be up to fifty percent 2 of a corporation's approved costs in relocating to 3 Indiana; provided that \$50,000,000 in new investment 4 5 and seventy-five new employees are required; 6 (2) Mississippi offers incentives for national and 7 regional relocation of headquarters between \$500 and 8 \$2,000 per new job for a period of up to five years; 9 10 South Carolina has a twenty percent credit against (3) 11 corporate income tax liability, based on the cost of 12 the portion of the facility dedicated to headquarters 13 operation or direct lease costs for the first five 14 years of operation; 15 16 Tennessee provides a refundable tax credit for (4)17 18 relocation expenses resulting from a move where the credit can be used to offset franchise or excise tax 19 liability in the year earned; provided that the tax 20 liability is less than the credit, the difference is 21 refunded in cash; 22 23 Florida's discretionary grant funding may be available 24 (5) so long as fifty jobs are created in a three-year 25 26 period and an investment of at least \$50,000,000 is 27 made; 28 (6) West Virginia offers a credit of up to ten percent of 29 the company's qualified investment to offset corporate 30 31 income and business franchise tax liability for up to thirteen years; 32 33 Wisconsin provides a refundable business tax credit 34 (7) based upon a percentage of wages paid to eligible 35 headquarter employees and, in addition to 36 37 reimbursement of up to fifty percent of training costs, the company can earn credits for up to three 38 percent of capital investment in personal property and 39 up to five percent of investment in real property 40 provided that a new investment of \$1,000,000 is 41 42 required;
