SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF MANDATING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR ANNUAL MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING.

WHEREAS, according to the National Institute for Mental 1 2 Health, in 2019, approximately 51,500,000, or eighteen percent, of adults in the United States experience a mental illness or 3 disorder; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, only forty-four percent of those individuals received mental health services for their mental illness; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, mental health issues are closely tied to physical 10 health issues, such as increased occurrences of chronic diseases including cardiovascular disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma, 11 12 epilepsy, and cancer; and 13 14 WHEREAS, mental health issues cost the United States economy close to \$200,000,000,000 in lost wages and 15 \$100,000,000 in healthcare costs; and 16 17 WHEREAS, suicide is the tenth leading cause of death in the 18 19 United States, costing approximately \$51,000,000,000 each year; and 20 21 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 728, Regular Session of 2021, would 22 require health insurers and similar entities that provide 23 coverage for health care to provide coverage for annual mental 24 health screenings; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 23-51, Hawaii Revised 28 Statutes, before any legislative measure that mandates health 29 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 30 31 of individual or group health insurance policies, can be



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considered, a concurrent resolution shall be passed that 1 2 designates a specific legislative bill for the Auditor to review and on which to prepare a report for submission to the 3 Legislature that assesses both the social and financial effects 4 of the proposed mandated coverage under that legislative bill; 5 6 now, therefore, 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 8 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 10 requested to conduct an assessment, pursuant to sections 23-51 11 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of the social and financial 12 13 effects of mandating health insurance coverage for annual mental health screenings, as provided in S.B. No. 728, Regular Session 14 15 of 2021; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 18 19 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 20 2022; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and Insurance Commissioner. 25
