SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR'S COORDINATOR ON HOMELESSNESS TO INCLUDE A REPRESENTATIVE FROM A LGBTQ+-FOCUSED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE HAWAII INTERAGENCY COUNCIL ON HOMELESSNESS TO ADDRESS THE SPECIFIC NEEDS OF LGBTQ+ YOUTH ACROSS THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, homelessness continues to be a significant issue
2 throughout the State and an estimated fifteen thousand
3 individuals are reported to be homeless; and
4

5 WHEREAS, in the wake of the coronavirus disease 2019
6 pandemic, the number of homeless individuals is expected to
7 increase across the State; and
8

9 WHEREAS, homelessness disproportionately impacts LGBTQ+
10 youth throughout the State; and
11

12 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth are more than twice as likely to
13 experience homelessness than other children and it is estimated
14 that forty percent of homeless youth are LGBTQ+, most often due
15 to familial rejection; and
16

17 WHEREAS, without targeted support services, LGBTQ+ youth
18 face social stigma and discrimination, which contributes to the
19 physical and mental strains and challenges with which they
20 struggle; and
21

22 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth are often at a heightened risk of
23 violence, abuse, and exploitation compared to their heterosexual
24 peers; and
25

26 WHEREAS, homelessness is a crisis that necessitates
27 increased collaboration and planning between the State,
28 counties, neighborhood boards, and nonprofit organizations and



1 those plans should address the specific needs of LGBTQ+ youth;
2 and
3

4 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Interagency Council on Homelessness was
5 created to assure that a broad interagency, interdisciplinary,
6 and community-based approach is brought to bear to reduce and
7 end homelessness in Hawaii; and
8

9 WHEREAS, despite the disproportionate impact of
10 homelessness on LGBTQ+ youth, the Hawaii Interagency Council on
11 Homelessness fails to include a representative from a LGBTQ+
12 non-profit organization in its membership and therefore cannot
13 adequately address the specific needs of homeless LGBTQ+ youth;
14 now, therefore,
15

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
17 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the
18 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor's
19 Coordinator on Homelessness, as Chairperson of the Hawaii
20 Interagency Council of Homelessness, is urged to include a
21 representative from a LGBTQ+-focused nonprofit organization as a
22 member of the Hawaii Interagency Council on Homelessness to
23 assist in developing an approach to ending homelessness that
24 addresses the specific needs of LGBTQ+ youth across the State;

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on
28 Homelessness is requested to reach out to various organizations
29 throughout the State that provide targeted outreach services
30 that meet the specific needs of LGBTQ+ youth; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor's
34 Coordinator on Homelessness.
