SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ALLOW FAITH PODS BASED ON KAPU ALOHA TO BE ESTABLISHED WITHIN EACH CORRECTIONAL CENTER.

WHEREAS, native Hawaiians are severely overrepresented in 1 the State's prison population and have a much higher recidivism 2 rate than non-Hawaiians; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Pu'uhonua is defined as "a place of refuge, sanctuary, asylum, place of peace and safety" and is based on 6 7 Hawaiian cultural practices that can help the native Hawaiian community and the community at-large; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Pu'uhonua is a decentralized wellness center that 10 can act as an alternative to building more prisons in the State 11 and is based on healing inhabitants and eventually returning 12 them back to the community; and 13 14 WHEREAS, there is a resurgence of Hawaiian cultural 15 practices and an increased focus on the importance of 16 17 maintaining Hawaiian cultural practices; and 18 WHEREAS, non-violence has always been key to Hawaiians, as 19 represented in the Hawaiian cultural practice of kapu aloha; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, incarcerated individuals, or pa'ahao, have initiated Hawaiian cultural programs within different 23 24 correctional systems known as "faith pods" throughout the nation to help promote safe spaces to heal and regain their identity as 25 Hawaiians; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, Act 117, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, sought to "[r]educe recidivism, prevent crime, and ensure long-term 29 positive change by developing a plan to create a wellness center 30 that reestablishes highly recognized native Hawaiian cultural 31

practices to restore the overall well-being of persons, 1 2 families, and the native Hawaiian community"; and 3 4 WHEREAS, there have been many attempts to improve the correctional system in the State but none has provided Hawaiians 5 with the opportunity to practice native Hawaiian cultural 6 practices; now, therefore, 7 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 11 12 Public Safety is requested to allow "faith pods" based upon kapu aloha to be established within each correctional center in the 13 State to allow incarcerated individuals a choice to reestablish 14 recognized native Hawaiian cultural practices to restore the 15 overall well-being of the Hawaiian community; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 18 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Public 19 20 Safety and Chairperson of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs board of trustees. 21 22 23 a 24 OFFERED BY:
