## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

CONVENING A PUBLIC RACING FACILITY WORKING GROUP TO LOCATE AND ESTABLISH PUBLIC RACING FACILITIES ON OAHU TO IMPROVE SAFETY, BOOST ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, AND PROVIDE FOR RECREATION.

WHEREAS, automobile racing has a long and storied history 1 in Hawaii, encompassing drag racing, dirty track racing, rally 2 racing, karting, and road racing, among others; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, race track facilities have existed in every county in Hawaii and have been used for training courses by law 6 enforcement, state and county agencies, nonprofit organizations, 7 8 and the general public; and 9 10 WHEREAS, race track facilities can host local, national, and international racing events that can create jobs, support 11 12 local businesses, and draw attention and visitors to Hawaii; and 13 14 WHEREAS, similar public facilities have long existed for numerous recreational and educational activities including field 15 sports such as football and baseball, indoor sports such as 16 basketball and volleyball, and other sports such as swimming, 17 archery, shooting, and golf; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, in 2006, the last racing facility on Oahu closed, resulting in many people illegally racing on public streets; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to support the establishment of new racing facilities open to the general 24 public that can serve as an alternative to illegal street 25 racing, provide for driver education and training, enhance 26 public recreation, create jobs, events, and exposure to 27 diversify and boost the local economy; and 28 29



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WHEREAS, racing facilities should, at a minimum, include 1 2 one facility for a kart track and one facility for a road course that may be used for driver training by law enforcement, state 3 4 and county agencies, nonprofit organizations, or the general 5 public; and 6 7 WHEREAS, racing facilities should be appropriately located away from residential areas to mitigate traffic, noise, and 8 9 other issues; now, therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 11 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that a public racing 13 14 facility working group be convened to identify a location and develop a plan for the establishment and operation of public 15 racing facilities on the island of Oahu to improve safety, boost 16 17 economic activity, and provide for recreation; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group be comprised 20 of the following members, or their designees: 21 The Chairperson of the Senate Standing Committee on 22 (1)Transportation, who should serve as co-chair of the 23 working group; 24 25 A member of the House of Representatives to be 26 (2) appointed by the Speaker of the House of 27 28 Representatives, who should serve as co-chair of the 29 working group; 30 31 (3) The Director of Transportation; 32 33 (4)The Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; 34 35 (5) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 36 37 Resources; 38 39 (6) The President and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Tourism Authority; 40 41 (7) The Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu; 42
