SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EXPLORE THE CREATION OF A SUSTAINABILITY FUND OR OTHER METHODS OF INCREASING FUNDING TO COMMUNITY CARE FOSTER FAMILY HOME AND EXPANDED ADULT RESIDENTIAL CARE HOME PROVIDERS.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has a limited number of beds 1 in nursing homes for patients requiring the level of care 2 provided by nursing homes; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Community Care Foster Family Home (CCFFH) program and Expanded Adult Residential Care Home (E-ARCH) 6 7 program provide additional options for patients requiring nursing home level care throughout the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, careqivers in CCFFHs and E-ARCHs effectively 10 11 provide the proper care needed for nursing home level patients, including assistance with Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) 12 specialized care such as the use of feeding tubes, catheters, 13 providing basic wound care, maintenance exercise programs, 14 cognitive stimulation, dietary management, and other custodial 15 care as needed; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the ARCH program was introduced in Hawaii in the 18 1950s or earlier to provide assisted living type care; it was 19 expanded in 1994 to provide nursing home level care as the E-20 ARCH program under the Department of Health, serving 21 22 approximately fourteen hundred patients with the potential for an even greater capacity; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the pilot CCFFH program was started in 1979 by The Queen's Medical Center, where it began receiving Medicaid 26 funding under a federal Medicaid waiver in 1984, initially under 27 the direction of the Department of Human Services and is 28 presently situated in the Department of Health; and 29



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1 WHEREAS, the CCFFH program is currently serving 2 approximately three thousand patients, with the potential for 3 even greater capacity; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the 1984 CCFFH federal Medicaid waiver was 6 7 approved based on its success as a high-quality alternative to nursing home placement for Medicaid patients that costs two-8 thirds or less than the cost of placement in a nursing home; and 9 10 WHEREAS, nursing facilities in the State do not have enough 11 beds to accommodate patients requiring the level of care 12 provided in nursing facilities, and the CCFFH and E-ARCH 13 programs grant patients additional options to receive adequate 14 care; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the CCFFH and E-ARCH programs allow reduction of 17 18 hospital stays by patients requiring nursing home level of care and provide relief to families caring for a family member with 19 20 such needs, which can lead to a reduction of morbidity and 21 mortality in those patients; and 22 WHEREAS, although the CCFFH and E-ARCH programs provide the 23 24 same level of care for patients at nursing facilities, unlike the sustainability fund established for nursing facilities, 25 there is no similar fund directly related to CCFFH and E-ARCH; 26 27 and 28 WHEREAS, establishing a CCFFH and E-ARCH sustainability 29 fund will provide an affordable system for long-term care for 30 patients outside of nursing facilities; now, therefore, 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 34 35 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Human Services is requested to convene a working group to 36 explore all payment methodologies, including creating a 37 sustainability fund or other methods of increasing funding to 38 Community Care Foster Family Home and Expanded Adult Residential 39 Care Home providers; and 40 41
