SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING GLEANING IN STATE AND COUNTY PARKS.

1 WHEREAS, a 2012 report from the Department on Business, Economic Development, and Tourism on food insecurity and food 2 self-sufficiency stated that about eighty-five to ninety percent 3 of the State's food is imported; and 4 5 WHEREAS, local families, restaurants, and farmers are among 6 7 those who were greatly impacted by the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Pacific Business News reported that the State experienced the highest increase in unemployment rates in the 11 nation between January and December of 2020 at two hundred one 12 percent; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Restaurant Association reported that at 15 least fifteen percent of the State's 3,600 restaurants have 16 closed down since the pandemic began; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture estimates that farmers have lost fifty to sixty percent of their market because 20 21 of shutdowns last year; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Foodbank has distributed over nineteen 24 million pounds of food to Hawaii residents between March through November of 2020; and 25 26 WHEREAS, there has been a great increase of food insecure 27 residents in Hawaii last year, and this increased reliance on 28 29 food assistance highlights the vulnerability of Hawaii's food 30 supply; and 31

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WHEREAS, gleaning is an ancient agricultural practice of 1 2 food recovery that the United States Department of Agriculture defines as the act of collecting excess fresh foods from farms, 3 gardens, farmers markets, grocers, restaurants, state or county 4 fairs, or any other sources in order to provide it to those in 5 need; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the legislature recognizes the opportunity to increase the self-sufficiency and food security of the State by 9 examining and building upon the State's ability to utilize 10 gleaning in state and county parks; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 14 15 House of Representatives concurring, that there be convened a 16 working group to examine and make recommendations regarding gleaning in state and county parks; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group examines and identifies: 20 21 (1) 22 Gleaning activities in state and county parks; 23 (2) 24 Types of foods that are gleaned in state and county 25 parks; 26 27 (3) Recommended strategies to promote awareness of 28 gleaning in state and county parks, including potential gleaning initiatives the State can implement 29 30 to benefit its communities; and 31 32 (4) Other topics as the working group deems necessary; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group consists of 35 the following members or their designees: 36 37 (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 38 Resources; 39 (2) The Dean of the University of Hawaii College of 40 Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; 41 42



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(3)	The Director of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Parks and Recreation;
(4)	The Director of the County of Maui Department of Parks and Recreation;
(5)	The Director of the County of Hawaii Department of Parks and Recreation; and
(6)	The Director of the County of Kauai Department of Parks and Recreation; and

16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members select a chair of 18 the working group from among themselves and that the chair of 19 the working group be assigned the administrative 20 responsibilities of the working group; and	
BE IS	F FURTHER RESOLVED the working group is requested to Y September 1, 2021 and hold no fewer than three prior to the Regular Session of 2022; and
to submit including than twent	FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested a report of its findings and recommendations, any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later ty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session and that the working group be dissolved on June 30,
