## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP FUNDING SOURCES FOR RURAL BROADBAND IMPROVEMENTS.

WHEREAS, broadband connectivity is the critical 1 infrastructure of the 21st century, and as such, the State 2 recognizes robust broadband infrastructure as foundational to 3 Hawaii's economic future and, as importantly, the quality of 4 life of all its residents; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, in 2012 the State Broadband Strategic Plan was developed to provide information and a framework for the 8 creation of policies and programs to address the challenges 9 faced in meeting both state and national broadband goals. The 10 plan supported grant-seeking at the state and county levels to 11 implement the recommended policies, programs, and activities to 12 advance broadband access and use statewide; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the economic and business incentives to deploy 15 broadband infrastructure continue to be insufficient to ensure 16 full access to broadband services in low-density, rural 17 18 locations, and other unserved and underserved areas of the State; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, economically feasible deployment of infrastructure for high-speed broadband across the State, especially to low 22 population density areas, presents a formidable challenge 23 because the unit costs of providing broadband service may not 24 provide an adequate return on investment; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the unique geography of the State prevents the use 27 of less costly options than broadband services for connectivity 28 by rural areas; and 29 30



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WHEREAS, in March 2020, the coronavirus disease 2019 was 1 detected in the State, upending all that residents knew as 2 normal. Governor Ige was joined by the Mayors from all four 3 counties in mandating restrictions and policies on operations, 4 travel between the islands, and work-from-home policies; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the drastic and sudden change required leaders and 7 managers in government, business, education, and nonprofits to 8 9 expeditiously address functions and communications to perform 10 their duties in a virtual mode; and 11 WHEREAS, the pandemic and its broad adverse economic impact 12 underscored that access to broadband services in unserved and 13 14 underserved areas of Hawaii would enhance economic development, education, healthcare, public safety, and emergency services in 15 16 those areas; and 17 18 WHEREAS, with thousands in the State forced to function from residences, workers relied on the quality of their internet 19 connections for access to virtual communications; and 20 21 WHEREAS, in establishing distance learning procedures, 22 public and private schools soon discovered that pockets of 23 students needed tailored solutions for access to hardware and to 24 25 Wi-Fi; and 26 27 WHEREAS, while nonprofits adjusted annual plans to effectively serve their target populations virtually and the 28 State relied on social media and websites to keep constituents 29 informed on the latest developments and public health 30 procedures, the common thread was broadband access, and the 31 dependence on access to broadband infrastructure; and 32 33 34 WHEREAS, although broadband coverage in the State is 35 widespread, additional investment must be made to respond to the needs of rural and low-income communities to bridge the digital 36 37 divide; now, therefore, 38 39 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 40 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 41 Business, Economic Development and Tourism is requested to 42
