SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DISABILITY AND COMMUNICATION ACCESS BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES, TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP ON ACCESSIBLE GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS.

1 WHEREAS, an accessible document is a document created to be 2 as easily readable by a sighted reader as a low-vision or non-3 sighted reader; and 4 5 WHEREAS, accessible documents allow individuals who use 6 screen readers to navigate through the document, utilize the 7 properties to move from one part of a document to another, hear 8 descriptions of photographs and images from image tags, and have

10 11 WHEREAS, public agencies that are required to provide 12 accessible documents do not always have staff that understand 13 how to make the information accessible; and 14

equal access to the information; and

WHEREAS, the increasing use of technology to communicate can also present complications and challenges, such as the various state agency websites that post public meeting notices, agendas, and attached resource documents that may not necessarily all be in accessible formats, especially when attachments are scanned copies; and

22 WHEREAS, the State's Disability and Communication Access Board serves as the public advocate of persons with disabilities 23 by providing advice and recommendations on matters relating to 24 access, with an emphasis on state and county legislative matters 25 and administrative rules, policies, and procedures, and also 26 provides technical assistance and guidance to state and county 27 entities to meet state, federal, and county requirements for 28 access for persons with disabilities; and 29 30
