SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII COMMUNITY FOUNDATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP MODEL TO PREPARE FOR HAWAII'S POST-PANDEMIC RECOVERY.

1	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted Hawaii's
2 3	communities and economy in unprecedented ways; and
4	WHEREAS, the complexity of the impact required an urgent
5	response that engaged every sector of our community; and

7 8	WHEREAS, the response required public, private, and non-profit organizations to work together to provide necessary
o 9	assistance to address the complexity and wide range of responses
10	needed across the State; and

12	WHEREAS, multi-sector approaches during the pandemic led to
13	significant and lasting results; and

15 16	WHEREAS, as the State shifts to post-pandemic recovery and new ways to work toward a more resilient Hawaii, recovery
17	efforts require the dedicated and thoughtful engagement of
18	government, private sector, and non-profit partners who are
19	steeped in experience and innovation; and

21	WHEREAS, if Hawai'i expects to solve its most difficult
22	problems, it must commit to collaborative and long-term
23	engagement of multiple sectors of the community to develop
24 25	strategies and macro-level models that the public and private sectors can embrace; now, therefore,

27	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
28	Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the
29	House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Community
30	Foundation, in collaboration with the President of the Senate

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and Speaker of the House of Representatives, is requested to 1 convene a working group of public, private, and non-profit 2 leaders to create a public-private partnership model to prepare 3 for Hawaii's post-pandemic recovery; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Community Foundation 6 7 and Legislative Reference Bureau are requested to provide 8 technical and substantive resources to assist in this effort; 9 and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Community Foundation is requested to submit a report of its findings and 12 13 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the Regular 14 15 Session of 2022; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 18 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 19 Legislative Reference Bureau and President of the Hawaii Community Foundation. 20 21 22 23 OFFERED BY: MUN.
