SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INVOLVE
GOVERNMENT AND STAKEHOLDERS AT ALL LEVELS IN A
COMPREHENSIVE AND COOPERATIVE PROCESS TO DEVELOP THE
STATEWIDE TRANSPORTATION PLAN.

1 WHEREAS, the mission of the Department of Transportation is
2 to provide a safe, efficient, accessible, and sustainable inter-
3 modal transportation system that ensures the mobility of people
4 and goods, and enhances and preserves economic prosperity and
5 the quality of life; and

7 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation is responsible
8 for the planning, design, construction, operation, and
9 maintenance of state facilities across all modes of
10 transportation, including air, water, and land; and

11
12 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation continuously
13 coordinates with other state, county, and federal agencies and
14 programs to develop and maintain a multi-modal and inter-modal
15 transportation system; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has three
18 Divisions -- Airports, Harbors, and Highways -- that provide,
19 operate, and maintain eleven commercial service airports, four
20 general aviation airports, ten active commercial harbors, and
21 more than nine hundred eighty centerline miles of highway; and

22
23 WHEREAS, Chapter 279A of the Hawaii Revised Statutes
24 establishes requirements for the development of a new statewide
25 transportation plan; and

26
27 WHEREAS, federal regulations require a continuing,
28 cooperative, and comprehensive statewide transportation planning
29 process; and

31 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation's most recent
32 plan, titled *Hawaii Statewide Transportation Plan: Hawaii's*
33 *Multi-modal and Inter-modal Network*, was completed in 2011, a
34 decade ago; and



1 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation is currently
2 conducting an update of the Hawaii Statewide Transportation Plan
3 that includes an assessment of historic and existing conditions
4 and emerging trends; and

5
6 WHEREAS, this update is expected to shape the State's
7 transportation future; establish new statewide transportation
8 planning goals and objectives that define the ideal future
9 transportation system, based on the priorities of the people of
10 the State; and recommend strategies and approaches for the
11 advancement of Hawaii's transportation goals; and

13 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the people of the
14 State to support the update of the Hawaii Statewide
15 Transportation Plan; now, therefore,

16
17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021,
19 that the Department of Transportation is requested to involve
20 government and stakeholders at all levels in a comprehensive and
21 cooperative process to develop the statewide transportation
22 plan; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the statewide transportation
25 plan be designed to achieve the following objectives:

27 (1) Provide an overarching policy framework and statewide
28 priorities for transportation planning and act as an
29 umbrella to inform the Department of Transportation
30 modal plans, as well as transportation plans developed
31 by the Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization, Maui
32 Metropolitan Planning Organization, and the county
33 governments;

35 (2) Incorporate research, policies, strategies, and
36 findings of the Department of Transportation modal
37 plans and other transportation plans;

39 (3) Develop statewide transportation planning goals and
40 objectives, as well as implementation strategies and
41 recommendations to accomplish those goals; and

1 (4) Recommend progress indicators to be instituted by the
2 Department of Transportation to ensure efficient and
3 cost-effective implementation of the statewide
4 transportation plan; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
7 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Attorney General;
8 Director of Transportation; and respective Mayors of the City
9 and County of Honolulu and counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui.
