SB 855, SD1
(SSCR584)
RELATING TO COFFEE PEST CONTROL.
Extends the sunset date for the coffee berry borer pesticide subsidy
program to 6/30/2023 and the program manager position, including the

program to 6/30/2023 and the program manager position, including the position's civil service and collective bargaining laws exemption, to 6/30/2024. Provides that no single coffee grower shall receive more than \$12,000 for each pest per year in subsidies between 6/30/2021, and 7/01/2023. Requires the department of agriculture to compile a list

of certain pesticides. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 512, SD2 RELATING TO SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE AGR, HHH, FIN

(SSCR579) PROGRAM INCENTIVES.
Status Removes the \$10 per visit per day cap on the dollar-for-dollar match

received by supplemental nutrition assistance program beneficiaries under the Hawaii healthy food incentive program, also known as the double up food bucks program. Specifies that healthy proteins are eligible purchases under the program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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<u>SB 336, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR242</u>) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LOANS. Increases the Board of Agriculture Chairperson's authority to approve agricultural loans and aquacultural loans not to exceed \$50,000 of state funds, rather than \$25,000. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
SB 668, SD1 (SSCR572) Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Renames the agricultural development and food security special fund as the land-, aquaculture-, freshwater-, or sea-based food development and food security special fund and expands the scope of the special fund to include land-, aquaculture-, freshwater-, or sea-based food production. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
SB 179, SD2 (SSCR575) Status	RELATING TO IRRIGATION. Transfers operational authority over portions of the east Kauai irrigation system operated and maintained by the east Kauai water users' cooperative before 12/15/20, to the Department of Agriculture. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
SB 343, SD1 (SSCR43) Status	RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT OF AN ANIMAL. Establishes the crime of sexual assault of an animal. Provides that the sexual assault of an animal is a class C felony or a class B felony if the offense subjects a minor to sexual contact with an animal or is committed in the presence of a minor. (SD1)	AGR, JHA
