HB 944RELATING TO THE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF THEStatusINSURANCE COMMISSIONER.Adopts certain provisions of the National Association of InsuranceCommissioners' Producer Licensing Model Act, Public AdjusterLicensing Model Act, Reinsurance Intermediary Model Act, andIndependent Adjuster Licensing Model Guidelines to provideconsistency and promote efficiency in processing insurance licensingfees, applications, certificates, registrations, and renewals.

HB 947 Status	RELATING TO HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS. Establishes the Safe Home Program to provide matching and nonmatching grants for installation of wind resistive devices to single- family, owner-occupied, residential property owners upon certain circumstances. Creates one temporary position within the Insurance Division of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to implement and administer the Safe Home Program.	CPC, FIN
<u>HB 424, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR250)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT OF CONTRACTS FOR VEHICLE RENTAL. Requires all agencies of the State, when renting a vehicle on behalf of a state employee conducting official government business, to adopt a preference for renting electric vehicles or hybrid vehicles; provided that such a vehicle is suitable for the specific travel requirements and available when needed. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	GVR, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 472, HD1</u> (HSCR212) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TELEHEALTH. Exempts telehealth-related gifts from procurement requirements. Codifies the authorization of advanced practice registered nurses to use telehealth to assist a patient, including those advanced practice registered nurses who are not licensed in the State, under certain conditions. Makes permanent certain telehealth-related exemptions for licensed health professions issued by recent gubernatorial proclamation. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PDP/HHH, CPC, FIN
