HB 396 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN

Status Allows nonprofit organizations to establish an applicant governing

board and develop a charter application for a start-up or conversion charter school; provided that (1) the governing board operates

separately from the nonprofit organization and (2) the governing board may include members of the nonprofit organization, but such members shall not constitute a majority of the governing board's members.

HB 1221 RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

NG TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. EDN, FIN

Status Requires charter school authorizers to provide a list of approved

independent auditors, rather than selecting three independent auditors, from which their respective charter school is to select an independent

auditor for its annual financial audit.

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<u>HB 514</u> RELATING TO ON-SITE EARLY CHILDHOOD FACILITIES. EDN, FIN

Status Establishes an income tax credit for employers who create on-site early childhood facilities. Establishes and appropriates funds for 1.0 FTE

childhood facilities. Establishes and appropriates funds for 1.0 FTE on-site early childhood facility coordinator position. Applies to

taxable years beginning after 12/31/2021.

HB 546 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, JHA

Status Amends the composition of the early learning board to make a

representative from Aha Punana Leo a standing member.

HB 1360 RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. EDN, FIN

Status Establishes an early childhood educator stipend program to be

administered by the executive office on early learning to address the shortage of qualified early childhood educators in Hawaii. Requires stipend fund repayments for the early childhood educator stipend program to be deposited into the early learning special fund.

HB 1362 RELATING TO ACCESS TO LEARNING. EDN, FIN

Status Establishes the Hawaii early childhood educator stipend program to

address shortage of early childhood education educators. Extends certain effective dates for implementation of Act 46, SLH 2020. Requires the application of a uniform assessment for public and charter school kindergarten students. Allows educational data to be shared

using an existing system. Appropriates funds.

DECISION-MAKING

The following bill(s) is for decision-making purposes only to insert substantive provisions into the short form bill. A public hearing will be scheduled at a later date, at which time testimony will be accepted.

HB 613 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN

Status Short form bill relating to education.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, remote testifiers' written submissions will be considered by the committee.
