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SB 932, SD2 (SSCR940)

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Status

Establishes the clean energy and energy efficiency revolving loan fund. Repeals the building energy efficiency revolving loan fund. Authorizes moneys in the green infrastructure special fund to be used

to finance the option to purchase solar energy systems and other clean energy equipment, including the purchase or lease of electric vehicles. Appropriates an unspecified amount out of the clean energy and energy

efficiency revolving loan fund. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD2)

SB 920, SD2 (SSCR912) Status

RELATING TO STATE LIGHT DUTY VEHICLES.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes clean ground transportation goals for state agencies to achieve a one hundred per cent light-duty motor vehicles zeroemission fleet by 12/31/2030. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 987, SD2 Proposed HD1 Status

RELATING TO GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Proposed HD1: Requires and establishes deadlines for state facilities, except smaller facilities and facilities at Aloha Stadium, to implement cost-effective energy efficiency measures to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Directs the Hawaii state energy office to collect utility bill and energy usage data for state-owned buildings and to make the data publicly available. Establishes a goal for the State to achieve at least a twenty-five per cent reduction in the electricity consumption of state facilities. Provides that certain agencies that perform energy efficiency retrofitting may continue to receive a certain amount of appropriations for energy expenditures. Beginning 7/1/2022, requires, where feasible and cost-effective, the design of all new state building construction to maximize energy and water efficiency, maximize energy generation potential, and use building materials that reduce the carbon footprint of the project. Effective 7/1/2050.
