HB 365 Status	RELATING TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE. Requires nominees for the position of deputy director of principal departments to be subject to advice and consent of the senate.	GVR, JHA, FIN
HB 366 Status	RELATING TO STATE DEPARTMENTS. Establishes repeal dates for each principal department, preceded by an auditor review. Establishes procedures for department termination in six-year intervals.	GVR, JHA, FIN
HB 376 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Allows purchasing agencies to use the second low bid method for procurement.	GVR, CPC, FIN

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RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE ELECTRONICS MANAGEMENT. GVR, HET, FIN HB 516 Status Requires persons who receive state funds and state financial assistance to donate unnecessary but functioning electronic devices, hardware, and televisions to nonprofit organizations that will refurbish and distribute them to eligible persons in the State. Sets reporting requirements for donating entities, nonprofit refurbishers, and the department of accounting and general services. Sets penalties for violations. RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. HB 526 GVR, JHA, FIN Requires the state procurement office to establish a past performance **Status** database. Requires that the determination of certain contract awards through the procurement process consider a contractor's past performance. Appropriates funds. HB 531 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS. GVR, AGR, FIN Status Requires a state contract for the purchase of produce to include an option to lease an appropriate amount of state agricultural lands under the control of the department of agriculture of sufficient area and quality to produce the crops being procured. Establishes a process for the college of tropical agriculture and human resources of the university of Hawaii to identify appropriate land to be leased. RELATING TO GIFT REPORTING. HB 645 GVR, JHA, FIN Status Exempts expenditures for meals or beverages with a total value of under \$25 from reporting requirements when provided to a public official at an informational meeting or presentation or goodwill event with non-lobbyists. HB 656 RELATING TO ELECTIONS. GVR, JHA, FIN **Status** Excludes from the definition of "advertisement" communications on clothing and other attire associated with a candidate's candidate committee. Removes clothing, other attire, yard signs, and sundry items and advertisements made by a candidate or candidate's candidate committee from electioneering communication reporting requirements. RELATING TO POLITICAL ADVERTISING. HB 660 GVR, JHA, FIN Prohibits the microtargeting of political advertisements on television **Status** and social media based on online behavioral data, demographic characteristics, and geographic location below the electoral district level. RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. HB 816 GVR, CPC, FIN Requires a contract for the purchase of local produce having a value of **Status** more than \$250 to be for a term of at least 5 years. HB 817 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. GVR, CPC, FIN Status Requires each state department to ensure that a certain percentage of

the produce purchased by that department is locally-grown.

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HB 841 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Allows any selection committee that evaluates an engineering, architectural, surveying, or landscape architectural professional service submittal for a state or county contract to require the top ranked competing professional service offerors to submit cost or pricing data on their respective proposals. Specifies that a purchasing agency is not required to disclose competing cost or pricing data to any party.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 844 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires past performance be considered in future bid selection of contractors for sole source contracts and any competitive sealed bid or proposal contracts that exceed the small purchase threshold. Requires procurement officers to consider specific factors, including past performance, when making a determination of offeror responsibility.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 849 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Establishes the functions of the contract administration office. Requires the procurement policy board to adopt rules for the administration of contracts. Requires the state procurement office to submit a progress report to the legislature.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 877 Status	RELATING TO THE APPRENTICESHIP AGREEMENT PREFERENCE. Repeals the public works construction bid performance for parties to registered apprenticeship agreements provided by section 103-55.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 878 Status	RELATING TO HAWAII PRODUCTS. Exempts construction procurements from section 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as it applies to construction procurements.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 424 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT OF CONTRACTS FOR VEHICLE RENTAL. Requires all state and county entities, when renting a vehicle on behalf of a state employee in the discharge of official government business, to rent electric or hybrid vehicles, in order of preference, provided that such a vehicle is suitable for the specific travel requirements and available when needed. Requires the State Procurement Office to promulgate rules and execute future contracts consistent with specified	GVR, CPC, FIN
