<u>HB 366</u>	RELATING TO STATE DEPARTMENTS.	GVR, JHA, FIN
<u>Status</u>	Establishes repeal dates for each principal department, preceded by an auditor review. Establishes procedures for department termination in six-year intervals.	
HB 376 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Allows purchasing agencies to use the second low bid method for procurement.	GVR, CPC, FIN

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HB 531 <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Requires a state contract for the purchase of produce to include an option to lease an appropriate amount of state agricultural lands under the control of the department of agriculture of sufficient area and quality to produce the crops being procured. Establishes a process for the college of tropical agriculture and human resources of the university of Hawaii to identify appropriate land to be leased.	GVR, AGR, FIN
<u>HB 645</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GIFT REPORTING. Exempts expenditures for meals or beverages with a total value of under \$25 from reporting requirements when provided to a public official at an informational meeting or presentation or goodwill event with non-lobbyists.	GVR, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 660</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO POLITICAL ADVERTISING. Prohibits the microtargeting of political advertisements on television and social media based on online behavioral data, demographic characteristics, and geographic location below the electoral district level.	GVR, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 844</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires past performance be considered in future bid selection of contractors for sole source contracts and any competitive sealed bid or proposal contracts that exceed the small purchase threshold. Requires procurement officers to consider specific factors, including past performance, when making a determination of offeror responsibility.	GVR, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 849</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Establishes the functions of the contract administration office. Requires the procurement policy board to adopt rules for the administration of contracts. Requires the state procurement office to submit a progress report to the legislature.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 878 Status	RELATING TO HAWAII PRODUCTS. Exempts construction procurements from section 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as it applies to construction procurements.	GVR, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 424</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT OF CONTRACTS FOR VEHICLE RENTAL. Requires all state and county entities, when renting a vehicle on behalf of a state employee in the discharge of official government business, to rent electric or hybrid vehicles, in order of preference, provided that such a vehicle is suitable for the specific travel requirements and available when needed. Requires the State Procurement Office to promulgate rules and execute future contracts consistent with specified terms.	GVR, CPC, FIN
HB 1325 Status	RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. Requires public contractors to obtain insurance to cover at least half of a project's construction costs to the State, to provide funds for curing construction defects discovered within five years after the completion of the contract. Authorizes the State to institute an action against the contractor for the total costs of curing those defects.	GVR, CPC, FIN

Requires procurement officers to document whether to pursue a design professional for damages in the event of construction cost overruns. Requires the chief procurement officer to compile a public list of construction companies or design professionals that are in noncompliance with the procurement code or owe penalties. Requires the state procurement office include training on the duty of procurement officers to hold design professionals liable for breaches of professional standards. Requires the legislative reference bureau to conduct a study on the laws and regulations relating to construction management policies and procedures applicable to the procurement code.
