<u>(HSCR651)</u>	Extende the purping facility quateinability program to 2024	

Extends the nursing facility sustainability program to 2024.

Status & Allows the nursing facility sustainability fee to be used to enhance capitated rates for the purpose of paying quality

incentives. Allows nursing facilities sixty days to pay the nursing facility sustainability fee. Specifies that the nursing facility sustainability fee limit is 5.5 per cent of overall net patient service revenue. Removes the per resident daily maximum fee of \$20 for each facility. Specifies facilities that meet certain exceptions shall pay a reduced daily fee in comparison to other participating facilities. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2060.

## HB 1283, HD1 RELATING TO HEALTH. HMS/HTH, WAM

(HSCR907)
Requires the employers of first responders to develop and provide dementia training to first responders. Permits the executive office on aging to set standards, frequency, and coordination of dementia training. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)
