SB 502, SD1 (SSCR28) Status & Testimony	PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO GUARANTEE ALL INDIVIDUALS THE RIGHT TO HAVE A CLEAN AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT. Proposes a constitutional amendment which guarantees individuals the right to a clean and healthy environment, including pure water, clean air, healthy ecosystems, and a stable climate, and to the preservation of the natural, cultural, scenic, and healthful qualities of the environment. Self- executing. (SD1)	AEN, JDC/WAM
SB 513 (SSCR325) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE ENFORCEMENT OF LAWS. Increases the fireworks display permit fee from \$110 to \$150 and the fine for certain fireworks violations from \$2,000 per violation to \$5,000 per violation. Clarifies that each aerial device, display firework, or article pyrotechnic having a total weight of 25 pounds or less that is illegally imported, transferred, or sold constitutes a separate violation. Increases the penalty for removing or extracting the pyrotechnic contents. Requires the Attorney General to establish an explosion detection technology working group. Requires the Department of Public Safety to develop and implement a web-based fireworks reporting tool. Authorizes the Sheriff Division to enforce the fireworks control law. Appropriates funds.	PSM, JDC/WAM

SB 912, SD1 (SSCR516) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Authorizes a court to order the forfeiture of one-half of the Employees' Retirement System (ERS) benefits of an ERS member, former member, or retirant upon conviction of the individual for a felony related to the State or county employment of the individual. Authorizes designated beneficiaries to receive the ERS benefits to which the member, former member or retirant would be entitled under this section upon the death of the member, former member, or retirant. Prohibits designated beneficiaries convicted of a felony under the same set of circumstances as the member, former member, or retirant who was subject to forfeiture of ERS benefits from receiving benefits. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	LCA, JDC/WAM
<u>SB 1313, SD1</u> (SSCR334) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO SPORT FISH. Requires the department of agriculture to allow for the permitted importation of northern largemouth bass and butterfly peacock bass into Hawaii through issuances of permits to the department of land and natural resources. Requires the division of aquatic resources to establish a pilot project to restock the Wahiawa public fishing area with northern largemouth bass, butterfly peacock bass, or both. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AEN/WTL, JDC/WAM
<u>SB 1368, SD1</u> (SSCR564) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO AIRFIELDS. Creates the Kawaihapai Airfield Revitalization Task Force to keep Kawaihapai Airfield open, provided that necessary issues are addressed. Requires the task force to report to the legislature. Sunsets on June 30, 2022. (SD1)	TRS, JDC/WAM
<u>SB 1401, SD1</u> (SSCR224) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Directs the department of transportation to fashion a complete streets policy and reporting requirements. (SD1)	TRS, JDC/WAM
