HB 360 Status RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING OR
REPEALING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED
STATUTES OR THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE
PURPOSES OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES,
CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, OR DELETING OBSOLETE OR
UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS.

Amends or repeals various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes or the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purposes of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, or deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions.

HEARING JHA 03-03-21

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RELATING TO THE BOARD OF A GRICULTURE. AGR, JHA HB 756, HD1 (HSCR283) Redesignates one of the at-large positions on the board of agriculture as an exofficio position, to be filled by the chairperson of the Status Hawaiian homes commission. (HD1) RELATING TO ETHICS. HB 741, HD1 GVR, JHA (HSCR532) Requires certain Hawaii state ethics commission records to be Status permanently retained. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1) RELATING TO LITTER CONTROL. HB 1102, HD1 EEP, JHA (HSCR420) Prohibits the intentional release of balloons inflated with a gas that is lighter than air. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1) Status RELATING TO VETERINARIANS. CPC, JHA HB 1086, HD1 (HSCR300) Provides veterinarians who provide emergency care to an animal **Status** immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Provides veterinarians who render emergency treatment when there is no veterinarian-client-patient relationship immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Requires veterinarians to report events of animal injury, death, or abuse to law enforcement where there is reasonable cause to believe that it relates to dogfighting or animal abuse and gives veterinarians immunity for civil liability for making the reports. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1) RELATING TO LIVING PARK PLANNING COUNCILS. HB 1029 WAL, JHA (HSCR545) Repeals Act 15, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, that authorized **Status** the establishment of living park planning councils. RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS. HB 901, HD1 EEP, JHA (HSCR425) Amends the environmental impact statement law to delete reference to **Status** discretionary permits in allowing infrastructure improvements within a highway or public right-of-way to be exempt from environmental impact assessment requirements. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1) HB 902, HD1 RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. HSG/WAL, JHA (HSCR177) Exempts land set aside by the governor to HHFDC and lands leased to HHFDC from other state departments or agencies from classification **Status** as public lands subject to DLNR management. Requires the land to be subject to legislative approval prior to the sale or gift of those lands. Requires HHFDC to return any land set aside by the governor or leased lands no longer needed for housing, finance, or development. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1) RELATING TO MINORS. ННН, ЈНА HB 282, HD1 (HSCR607) Expands the circumstances where a minor may consent to no cost Status emergency shelter and related services to include cases where the provider is coordinating with child welfare services. Effective

7/1/2060. (HD1)

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<u>HB 991, HD1</u> RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF VITAL STATISTICS HHH, JHA

(HSCR612) RECORDS.

Status Authorizes the department of health to disclose vital statistics records

for public health and law enforcement purposes. Updates eligibility requirements for access to confidential vital statistics records.

Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)

HB 608, HD1 RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. EDN, JHA

(HSCR347) Requires the board of education to hold no less than six community forums annually, with at least one forum in each county. Requires the

board to include an open forum for public comments on non-agenda items. Requires a report to the legislature on implementing open

forums. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

HB 1200 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. JHA

<u>Status</u> Prohibits the appointment of state officers and employees to boards

and commissions unless otherwise provided.

HB 144, HD1 RELATING TO ELECTIONEERING COMMUNICATIONS. GVR, JHA

(HSCR599) Increases the monetary threshold that requires disclosure of electioneering communications. Requires that disclosures of electioneering communications occur on the date the electioneering

communications are publicly distributed. Classifies election advertisements sent by mail at any postal rate as electioneering

communications. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1)

<u>HB 891, HD1</u> RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS. CPC, JHA

Proposed HD2 Proposed HD2: regulates the sale and use of electric guns and

<u>Status</u> cartridges.

The following measure(s) were previously heard on March 2, 2021. No public testimony will be accepted.

HB 1263, HD1 RELATING TO IGNITION INTERLOCK DEVICES. CPC, JHA

(HSCR291) Establishes a system of graduated penalties for violations of the ignition interlock law. Requires proof of compliance with the

ignition interlock law to be eligible to apply for a driver's license.

Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)

HB 576, HD2 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. HHH, CPC, JHA

(HS CR633) Authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to perform Status medication or as piration abortions. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD2)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.
