<u>SB 386, SD1, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR1090)</u> <u>Status</u> RELATING TO THE DETENTION OF A MINOR IN AN ADULT JAIL OR LOCKUP. Requires a family court to make findings, after a hearing and in writing, before a minor can be transferred to an adult jail or lockup or be permitted sight or sound contact with adult offenders, subject to certain circumstances. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1) HHH/CMV, JHA, FIN

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<u>SB 912, SD1, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR993)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Authorizes a court to order the forfeiture of one half of the employees' retirement system (ERS) benefits of an ERS member, former member, or retirant upon conviction of the individual for a felony related to the state or county employment of the individual. Authorizes designated beneficiaries to receive the ERS benefits to which the member, former member, or retirant would be entitled under this section upon the death of the member, former member, or retirant. Prohibits designated beneficiaries convicted of a felony under the same set of circumstances as the member, former member, or retirant who was subject to forfeiture of ERS benefits from receiving benefits. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	LAT, JHA, FIN
<u>SB 538, HD1</u> (HSCR990) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION. Clarifies the meaning of "program or activity receiving state financial assistance". Excludes cases within the scope of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act from the jurisdiction of the Hawaii civil rights commission. Effective 12/25/2040. (HD1)	LAT, JHA, FIN
<u>SB 1342, SD1, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR1060)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ILLEGAL GAMBLING. Includes under the offense of promoting gambling in the first degree the act of engaging in activities in which a persons receives or entertains other persons as guests with the intent of advancing gambling activity on real property. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)	CPC, JHA, FIN
