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RELATING TO TRAVEL. PDP/LAT, JHA, HB 1286 Status Exempts any person from the post-arrival mandatory self-quarantine if FIN the person receives a negative test result prior to arrival. Allows DOH to establish conditions for exemption. Requires certain COVID-19 tests for travelers who do not have a test result upon arrival to avoid mandatory self-quarantine. Requires any person who receives a positive test for COVID-19 post-arrival to be responsible for all costs associated with that person's mandatory self-quarantine. Repeals on 12/31/2021. HB 954 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PDP/LAT, FIN Status AGENCY. Converts the public information officer, civil defense administrative officer, branch chiefs, and emergency operations center state warning point personnel in the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency from civil service status to exempt status. HB 934 RELATING TO COVID-19. PDP, FIN Status Provides appropriations to continue funding for various COVID-19 response related programs and activities. RELATING TO THE STATE DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM. HB 955 PDP, FIN **Status** Establishes the Hawaii State Disaster Recovery Program and Framework and describes the role of the State Disaster Recovery Coordinator. MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS TO THE HB 962 PDP, FIN Status DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE RELATING TO COVID-19 EXPENDITURES. Provides emergency appropriations in fiscal year 2020-2021 to the Department of Defense to continue funding for various COVID-19 response related programs and activities. HB 963 MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE PDP, FIN OF THE GOVERNOR RELATING TO COVID-19 Status EXPENDITURES. Provides an emergency appropriation to the Office of the Governor in fiscal year 2020-2021 to continue funding for various COVID-19 response related programs and activities. HB 540 RELATING TO LIABILITY. PDP, JHA, FIN Status Makes immune from civil or criminal liability a health care provider who acts in good faith during a state of emergency or local state of emergency and adheres to crisis standards of care. RELATING TO PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS. PDP, CPC, FIN HB 425 **Status** Beginning 1/1/2022, prohibits the issuance of building permits for new building construction unless the applicant provides sufficient proof that the building will be able to withstand category four hurricanes. Beginning 1/1/2022, requires building permits to be obtained for work performed for state government agencies on all new public buildings, and requires new public buildings to be designed to withstand category

five hurricanes.
