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HB 775 Status	RELATING TO RENAMING KAHULUI AIRPORT ACCESS ROAD. Renames Kahului Airport Access Road on Maui as the Mayor Elmer F. Cravalho Way.	TRN, JHA
HB 832 Status	RELATING TO ROADS. Establishes a road connectivity task force to assess and identify ways of improving road access in rural areas and in subdivisions with substandard roads. Requires a report to the legislature.	TRN, FIN
HB 1063 Status	RELATING TO THE STATE HIGHWAY SAFETY COUNCIL. Reduces the membership of the State Highway Safety Council appointed by the Governor from twenty to ten.	TRN, FIN

<u>HB 1321</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires the posting of depth gauge signs, in a manner consistent with the Federal Highway Administration's Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, on any portion of a public highway that lies within a special flood hazard area and is prone to flooding. Appropriates funds.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1058</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Amends the law relating to registration renewals and initial registrations of motor carrier vehicles of any motor carrier who has an outstanding federal out-of-service order. Adds a definition for "out-of- service order".	TRN, CPC
<u>HB 1051</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AIRPORTS. Clarifies airport jurisdiction with respect to land use compliance and county permits.	TRN, FIN
HB 1052 Status	RELATING TO THE AIRPORT ZONING ACT. Establishes a five-mile airport hazard area for prevention of potentially hazardous conditions that may be caused by certain land uses or actions. Requires state and county agencies to coordinate land uses and permit approvals with the Hawaii Department of Transportation for land located in the airport hazard area.	TRN, JHA
HB 434 Status	RELATING TO AIRCRAFT. Establishes a non-commercial aircraft landing fee and non-commercial aircraft storage fee. Directs proceeds from these fees into the general fund. Defines "non-commercial aircraft".	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1093</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. Authorizes the director of transportation to transfer funding between program identification numbers within the harbors division; provided that the aggregate amount transferred in a fiscal year does not exceed an unspecified amount. <u>HB 1059</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Repeals sections 264-19, 266-2.3, and 266-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the purpose of deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions.	TRN, FIN
HB 194 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Extends the period in which a county may adopt a surcharge on state tax, under certain conditions, from 3/31/2019 to 6/30/2022.	TRN, FIN
HB 510 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes a vehicle registration fee tax credit for persons who are eligible for a refundable food/excise tax credit greater than \$0.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 64</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS. Abolishes, repeals, or reclassifies various non-general funds of the department of transportation.	TRN, FIN
