HB 414 Status	RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES. Prohibits the sale of coral products in the State and the importing and exporting of coral product.	WAL, CPC
HB 1258 Status	RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. Makes technical nonsubstantive amendments to the application requirements for water use permits.	WAL, JHA
HB 1351 Status	RELATING TO CONSERVATION MITIGATION BANKS. Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to establish and operate conservation mitigation banks to restore, create, enhance, or preserve conservation habitats or resources as compensatory mitigation. Authorizes the department to contract a third-party administrator for the operation of the mitigation banks.	WAL, FIN

<u>HB 486, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR78)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Specifies that a government agency does not assume ownership or jurisdiction over a disputed road through any maintenance or repair activities. Authorizes the State to transfer ownership of roads in favor of counties by quitclaim if requested by the county. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	TRN, WAL, JHA
<u>HB 77, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR117)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LANDS CONTROLLED BY THE STATE. Exempts the sale of the leased fee interest in certain affordable leasehold developments by the HHFDC from legislative approval. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HSG, WAL, FIN
<u>HB 502, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR118)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RURAL DISTRICTS. Authorizes the counties to adopt ordinances that allow up to one dwelling per quarter-acre in rural districts. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HSG, WAL, FIN
<u>HB 1070, HD1</u> (HSCR165) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO UNIVERSITY DISTRICTS. Provides a framework that supports consistent land use planning and development across the University of Hawaii system through designation of university districts and allows project partnerships with qualified persons. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)	HET, WAL, FIN
<u>HB 1130, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR209)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT. Requires the office of planning to hire a contractor to, among other things, identify and assess alternative financing, project delivery, and cost recovery mechanisms to recapture the State's upfront investment in transit-oriented development infrastructure. Requires the contractor to consult with representatives of certain government entities. Requires the office of planning to report its findings to the legislature. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	TRN/HSG, WAL, FIN
<u>HB 1352, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR169)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SURPLUS MILITARY LAND. Requires the office of planning to submit a report to the legislature containing: (1) an inventory of lands within the State that are leased or controlled by the federal government; (2) any known contaminants or environmental hazards associated with the inventoried lands based on past environmental studies; (3) input from executive branch departments and agencies on proposed alternative uses for the lands that would be consistent with their mission should the lands be returned to the State; and (4) its findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, based on this information. Effective 7/1/3050. (HD1)	CMV, WAL, FIN
<u>HB 856, HD1</u> (HSCR197) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WASTE MANAGEMENT. Part I: Clarifies that composting facilities are excluded from buffer zone requirements. Part II: Establishes a class of artisan-scale composting operations. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	EEP, WAL, FIN
