RELATING TO THE HAWAII HISTORIC PLACES REVIEW WAL, JHA HB 1031 Status BOARD. Reduces the number of members on the Hawaii Historic Places Review Board. HB 865 RELATING TO THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION WAL, FIN Status DIVISION. Directs the auditor to perform a comprehensive performance and management audit of the state historic preservation division. HB 663 RELATING TO THE GAME MANAGEMENT ADVISORY WAL, JHA Status COMMISSION. Amends the manner of appointment of members to the game management advisory commission. HB 820 RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCESS. WAL, JHA Status Provides that where public access is required as a condition of a subdivision, either the county must accept dedication of and maintain the access or identify an entity to own and maintain the access. Authorizes the county to require the subdivider to establish a stewardship fund for maintenance purposes. Takes effect 1/1/2022. RELATING TO TREES. WAL, FIN HB 135 Status Requires the department of accounting and general services and department of land and natural resources to require that, for all projects undertaken on state land or public land, three new trees are to be planted whenever an existing tree is cut down. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL WAL, FIN HB 1261 Status RESOURCES. Requires DLNR to lease to the Wailea Village Historic Preservation Community the property located at 29-169 Kulaiwi road in south Hilo on Hawaii island for twenty years for \$100 per year. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL WAL, FIN HB 1332 Status RESOURCES. Requires the department of land and natural resources to regularly maintain trails and streams under its jurisdiction on a regular or scheduled basis. HB 1021 RELATING TO THE INTERSTATE WILDLIFE VIOLATOR WAL, JHA Status COMPACT. Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources to enter into the Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact or similar agreement for mutual assistance in the enforcement of wildlife laws. HB 1346 RELATING TO FOOD SUSTAINABILITY. WAL, FIN Status Requires the department of agriculture, in coordination with the appropriate departmental agency, to prepare and periodically update a functional plan for seafood sustainability that expands the State's priority on food by including wild seafood as a viable food source.

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RELATING TO SPORT FISH.

Status

Requires the department of agriculture to allow for the permitted importation of northern largemouth bass and butterfly peacock bass into Hawaii. Requires the division of aquatic resources to establish a pilot project to restock the Wahiawa public fishing area with northern largemouth bass, butterfly peacock bass, or both.

RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF SHARKS.

Establishes an offense of knowingly capturing, entangling, or killing a shark in state marine waters, and provides penalties and fines.

Provides certain exemptions.

### DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, remote testifiers' written submissions will be considered by the committee.
