Aloha kākou,

January 15th marked the opening day of the 2020 legislative session. While I have great hopes for the coming year, I recognize that there is much work to be done to uplift our district.

One of the areas about which I've received a lot of concern, recently, is the rising tide of violence in Hawai'i. It seems like gun violence has become a fixture of the nightly news.

Our own community was shocked by the wave of violence earlier this month, when 30-year-old Malia Soma-Valmoja died after being shot on land controlled by the Agribusiness Development Corporation near Whitmore Village.

We also watched with sadness as a violent rampage near Diamond Head left two Honolulu Police Department officers and two community members dead, as seven homes burned to the ground.

We must get a handle on the mindless menace of violence that is escalating in Wahiawā and throughout our islands. I pledge to work with local and federal officials to ensure that the areas used as safe havens by violent criminals are thoroughly investigated.

Additionally, we must expand access to mental health services that prevent violence before it begins by addressing the psychological and emotional roots of crime.

Finally, I will work to make the ADC lands on which criminal activity is occurring a high priority for task forces that are dedicated to solving gun violence and organized crime in Hawai'i, as well as the State Auditor as his office launches a comprehensive assessment of the ADC's operations. When we work together, we can keep our streets and our neighborhoods safe and secure.

I've introduced over a dozen bills for the 2020 legislation session. Here are a few of my top priorities. I look forward to partnering with you to pass them into law this year.

GREEN JOBS: Creates clean energy jobs that meet or exceed the state's self-sufficiency standard.

MILITARY ECONOMIC IMPACT TASK FORCE:

Establishes a task force to evaluate the economic impact of the military's presence in Hawai'i, including on education, housing, land use, environmental restoration, and consumer spending.

FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS: Eliminates the general excise tax on menstrual products and expands free access to such products on public school campuses.
