Senator J. Kalani English has introduced bills for the 2006 legislative session aimed at facilities improvements within the 6th District, encouraging the development and use of renewable energy, and promoting Hawaiian language and culture.

"As the Senator from the state's most rural district, and its only multiisland district, I have a special responsibility," Sen. English said today. "It's important that my fellow legislators understand the needs of underserved areas and join me in giving them the support they deserve." Several of the bills provide funds for construction costs, capital improvements, and operating expenses at facilities that serve rural populations on Maui, Moloka'i, and Lāna'i.

Other measures address one of Sen. English's principal concerns: renewable energy. "A worldwide crisis in energy has made more people take a look at the benefits of renewables – especially as they relate to Hawai'i," Sen. English said. "the time is right for meaningful energy reform in our state."

Progress of bills introduced this session can be monitored online at the Hawaii State Legislature's website at http://www.capitol.hawaii. gov/. Sen. English's bills are numbered consecutively, from SB3152 to SB3193. From the website, you can search by bill number or subject, learn which committees are scheduled to hear each measure, which lawmakers have signed on as sponsors of a bill, and monitor how each legislator has voted.
