

2007 Year in Review

The 2007 Legislative Session was busy and productive. Working with new leadership and a fresh outlook, the Senate maintained its focus on our state's most pressing needs through not only the regular session, but three special sessions that considered veto overrides, judicial appointments, and critical issues requiring immediate legislative action.

With the 2007 session, Senator English formally assumed the chair of the Senate Committee on Transportation and International Affairs, and obtained seats on the Committee on Economic Development and Taxation, and the powerful Committee on Ways and Means. With Maui Senators Roz Baker and Shan Tsutsui also serving as Ways and Means Chair and Vice Chair, respectively, the Maui delegation maintained significant influence over the Senate's financial committee, and helped direct the appropriation of funds to projects vital to our islands, and across the state.

For the upcoming 2008 session, Senator English has also been appointed Vice Chair of the newlycreated Senate Committee on Agri-

culture and Hawaiian Affairs, providing him fresh opportunities to provide leadership on issues important to the Sixth District.

Senator English introduced or cosigned 160 bills and resolutions in the 2007 session. Seventeen of those bills passed into law, four of which Senator English introduced himself. "Of course, we always want to pass more," says Senator English, "but this is a good result when you consider that close to two thousand bills and nearly four hundred resolutions were introduced in the Senate last session. And the bills that haven't passed yet, 112 of them, are still alive for the upcoming session. I intend to keep working to pass those that mean the most to our district."


Among Senator English's bills that passed into law was **\$B1853** (Act 212), which established the 'aha kiole advisory committee. The committee will explore, examine and derive best practice models for the creation of an 'aha moku council system that will serve in an advisory capacity on matters related to our state's natural resources. The council will incorporate and represent all thirty-seven moku statewide, and enable the development of a comprehensive set of best practices for natural resources management, to reflect and sustain traditional Native Hawaiian practices.

New laws that grew out of bills that Senator English helped introduce include SB1917 (Act 222), which provides funding for additional homeless facilities, emergency shelters and transitional shelters. The law also supports agencies that offer outreach and support services to the homeless, and provides a funding mechanism for more affordable housing. SB1916 (Act 204) gives additional support to family and friends who act as caregivers to the elderly and disabled; it also appropriates funds to expand the kupuna care services programs. SB1066 (Act 9) will help reduce our state's exposure to invasive species. And SB1174 (Act 250) will make support programs available to the keiki of incarcerated parents, including programs that help develop more positive parent/child interactions.

During the first Special Session, Senator English joined with the Senate majority to override eleven of the governor's vetos. Included in that group was a **SB1191** (Act 10, SP1), which provides funding to improve pedestrian safety statewide.

As in previous sessions, Capital Improvement Projects for our district remained one of the Senator's top priorities. In all, he helped shepherd over \$83 million to projects in Hana, Upcountry, Kula, and Pukalani, as well as on Moloka'i and Lana'i. Those projects will help improve transportation, healthcare, and education.

Statewide projects with an impact on the Sixth District account for an additional \$50 million, for expenditures such as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, coqui frog control and eradication, highway improvements, and emergency medical services.

With the 2008 session scheduled to begin shortly, Senator English is prepared to continue his efforts on behalf of the district. "Working with my Senate colleagues and getting things done for our district and our state is really a collaborative effort. By the same token, I also see it as a collaboration with the people in our district. I need to keep hearing from them to understand their priorities and meeting their needs, and I intend to keep listening as long as they have anything to say. As much as the 2007 session was a success, I think we will do even better this year. That will be a tribute to everyone who took a little time to get involved."




