As city dwellers, we are all aware of the unique aspects of being "townies". While we enjoy many benefits from our close proximity to the State's Capitol district, historical and cultural riches, financial headquarters, and concentration of professional opportunities and retail establishments, we also recognize that we face unique and often difficult challenges.

Some of the challenges include an increase in homelessness, cost of living (housing), noise disturbances, among others.

In an effort to address some of these outlined issues, my colleagues and I who serve the urban core have formed the "Legislative"

Urban Caucus". Members include: myself, Senators Carol Fukunaga, Suzanne Chun Oakland, Brian Taniguchi and Les Ihara; Representatives Karl Rhoads. Tom Brower. Scott Nishimoto, Scott Saiki and Della Au Belatti; City Councilmembers: Ann Kobayashi, Lee Donohue and Rod Tam. Together we have met several times. The latest meeting took place on July 22nd and focused specifically on housing related issues.

We have broken up the needs in a multipronged approach by category that run the gamut:

- Emergency shelters
- Transitional housing.
- Affordable rentals for families and seniors

Affordable for-sales

Our next scheduled caucus meeting will take place on August 5th, and we will attempt to meet on a bi-weekly basis in order to plan a way forward with solutions to our most difficult problems.

While at this time. some of the highest concentration of homeless individuals can be found in Downtown, Kaka'ako and Waikiki, one thing to keep in mind is that the urban core issues have now started to spread to the surrounding areas of Honolulu. 
