

The 2010 Legislative Session is behind us...but the work continues. On June 21st we received a list compiled by the Governor which included 39 bills she is considering vetoing.

Here are a few of the items:

HB415 HD2 SD2 CD1 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

Authorizes an audit of the Dept. of Public Safety's contracts for prison beds and services outside the state of Hawaii and with the federal detention center in Honolulu.

HB444 HD1 SD1 RELATING TO CIVIL UNIONS.

Extends rights, benefits, protections and responsibilities to partners in a civil union.

HB2318 HD2 SD1 CD1 RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

Requires the Hawaii Public Housing Authority to establish "Housing First" programs to address the chronically homeless population in Hawaii.

HB2377 HD3 SD2 CD1 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Requires the members of the BOE to be appointed by the Governor after nomination and the Senate's advise and consent procedure. Underlying bill to the ballot referendum (HB2376).

SB2001 SD1 HD1 RELATING TO TAXATION.

Extends the Tax Credit for Research Activities by one year. Repeals the technology infrastructure and high tech business investment tax credits.

SB2045 SD1 HD1 CD1 RELATING TO CRIME.

Establishes class A and B felony sexual human trafficking offenses. Includes sexual human trafficking offenses in official proceedings or investigations that are to be given high priority for purposes of witness protection.

SB2473 SD1 HD2 CD1 RELATING TO HOUSING.

Allows grandchildren of elderly housing residents to temporarily reside in home (3 months) during certain family crisis situations without eviction and gives reentry priority to seniors who relocate during the family crisis.
