He is currently Director, Addiction Psychiatry/Addiction Medicine Training Programs and Deputy Program Director for the Core Psychiatric Residency Training Program; Principal Investigator and Co-Director of the Pacific Addiction Research Center; and Emeritus Chair of the Locomotor, Brain and Behavior component of the medical student education curriculum. His local, regional, and national service roles including immediate past Chair, Addiction Psychiatry Examination Committee, American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN); and current President-elect of the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). He is blessed with marriage to Dr. Libby Char, Assistant Clinical Professor of Surgery in Emergency Medicine; they live in Manoa Valley, Honolulu, Hawai'i.
