HB1074 RELATING TO THE COMMISSION FOR NATIONAL AND ECD, JHA COMMUNITY SERVICE.

> Transfers for administrative purposes only the Commission for National and Community Service from the University of Hawaii to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. Adds a representative from each county mayor?s office to the commission and a representative of the volunteer sector. Also changes meeting requirements from quarterly to twice

annually.

RELATING TO EMOLUMENTS. HB1075 JHA

> Beginning 11/1/2022, prohibits the lieutenant governor, while holding the office of the lieutenant governor, from maintaining any other employment, maintaining a controlling interest in a business, or receiving any emolument, beginning on the sixtyfirst calendar day after election or appointment to office.

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL HB1076 CMV, CPC

LICENSURE.

Specifies the documentation needed for a military spouse to receive a temporary licensure by endorsement. Requires issuance of the license within 30 days of the application and supporting documents.

HB1077 RELATING TO EOUITABLE GENDER REPRESENTATION

ON CORPORATE BOARDS.

Requires publicly held domestic corporations to include non-male and non-female individuals among the directors of their corporate board. Establishes reporting requirements for the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and penalties.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF HB1078 HHH, EDN, FIN

AND BLIND.

Requires the department of education to develop a plan to transition the Hawaii School for the Deaf and Blind to a conversion charter school.

HB1079 RELATING TO THE MODERNIZATION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE.

JHA. FIN

Eliminates the use of monetary bail, with certain exceptions, and requires defendants to be released on their own recognizance for traffic offenses, violations, non-violent petty misdemeanor offenses, and non-violent misdemeanor offenses. Creates a rebuttable presumption regarding both release and detention for

certain offenses and specifies circumstances in which these presumptions apply. Requires the judicial council to appoint a committee to review and recommend changes to the Hawaii

penal code.

RELATING TO THE PHASEOUT OF PRIVATE HB1080

CMV, JHA, FIN

CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

Requires the State to phase out the use of private correctional facilities to incarcerate Hawaii inmates. Prohibits the construction of new correctional facilities or the expansion of existing correctional facilities without the approval of the Hawaii

correctional system oversight commission.

RELATING TO SIDEWALKS. HB1081

TRN, FIN

Requires the department of transportation and each county's transportation department to create and maintain a priority list of sidewalk installation and improvement projects and to publish the priority list on their respective websites.

RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES. HB1082

CMV, JHA, FIN

Establishes a moratorium on the construction of any new correctional facilities in the State on or after 7/1/2021, including the planned construction of a new facility to replace the existing Oahu community correctional center. Prohibits the construction of new correctional facilities or the expansion of existing correctional facilities without the approval of the Hawaii correctional system oversight commission.

HB1083 RELATING TO THE LAW OF THE SPLINTERED PADDLE.

CAI, JHA Prohibits a county from enacting any ordinance that prohibits a

HB1084 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. WAL, CPC

Prohibits the harvesting of aquatic life for commercial aquarium

HB1085 RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT OF AN ANIMAL. AGR, JHA

Establishes the crime of bestiality. Provides that the bestiality is a class C felony or a class B felony if the offense subjects a minor to sexual contact with an animal or is committed in the presence of a minor.

RELATING TO VETERINARIANS. HB1086

CPC, JHA

Provides veterinarians who provide emergency care to an animal immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Provides veterinarians who render emergency treatment when there is no veterinarian-client-patient relationship immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Requires veterinarians to report events of animal injury, death, or abuse to law enforcement where there is reasonable cause to believe that it relates to dog fighting or animal abuse and gives veterinarians immunity for civil liability for making the reports.

HB1087 RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY. AGR, JHA

Prohibits specified trolleys, trolleys with swivels, pulleys, cables, or running lines designed to attach a dog to two stationary objects in a configuration that endangers the dog, including by depriving the dog of sustenance. Prohibits tethering or restraining a dog under the age of six months unless the dog is engaged in an activity supervised by its owner or an agent of its owner. Prohibits tethering or restraining a dog with a tow or log chain. Prohibits tethering or restraining a dog with a choke collar, pinch collar, or prong collar unless the dog is engaged in an activity supervised by its owner or an agent of its owner.

HB1088 RELATING TO COSMETICS. AGR, CPC, JHA

Bans the import for profit, sale, and offer for sale of any cosmetic in the State if the final product or any component of the final product was developed or manufactured using animal testing performed on or after 1/1/2022. Effective 1/1/2022.

RELATING TO FISHING. HB1089

WAL, JHA

Prohibits fishing at any time in the Waikiki-Diamond Head shoreline fisheries management area or the area between the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium and the Diamond Head Lighthouse. Effective 10/1/2021.

RELATING TO CHILD PASSENGER RESTRAINTS. HB1090

JHA, FIN

Amends requirements for child passengers. Requires rear facing child safety seats for children less than 2 years of age. Requires the use of child safety seats or booster seats for certain children less than 10 years of age. Raises certain fines for violations.

## **Committee** REFERRAL HB1091 RELATING TO THEFT. CPC, JHA Establishes the offense of theft of catalytic converter as a class C felony. Defines "catalytic converter." Requires scrap dealers to follow the same requirements regarding a written statement for the purchase of palladium, platinum, rhodium, and a scrap catalytic converter from which some or all of the catalyst metals have been removed as is required for the purchase of copper, beer kegs, and urns. RELATING TO CARBON OFFSETS. HB1092 EEP, CPC, FIN Establishes procedures for the department of transportation to assist and enable a person to voluntarily purchase a verified carbon offset for carbon dioxide emissions resulting from the person's air travel to or from an airport in the State. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HB1093 TRN, FIN TRANSPORTATION. Authorizes the director of transportation to transfer funding between program identification numbers within the harbors division; provided that the aggregate amount transferred in a fiscal year does not exceed an unspecified amount. HB1094 RELATING TO CONCESSIONS. TRN, CPC, FIN Provides the department of transportation with more flexibility and discretion to address substantial hardship situations that impact airport concession contracts. RELATING TO FERAL CHICKENS. WAL, FIN HB1095 Appropriates funds for the department of land and natural resources division of state parks to establish a program to eradicate feral chickens in state parks. HB1096 RELATING TO PARENTAGE. JHA, FIN Amends the Uniform Parentage Act to allow non-gestational partners to voluntarily establish parentage of a child during the period immediately prior to or following the birth of the child. Requires the State to recognize parentage determinations from other states and territories. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND HB1097 ECD, CPC, FIN CONSUMER AFFAIRS.

Amends the name of the certificate of good standing issued by the department of commerce and consumer affairs to "certificate

of registration."

<u>HB1105</u> RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS CANDIDATE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

HET, JHA

Requires the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to present candidates for the board regents who reflect the diverse student population, counties, and higher education-related stakeholders. Amends the various appointing authorities of members of the candidate advisory council. Amends the terms of members of the candidate advisory council.

<u>HB1106</u> RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHH, JHA, FIN

Requires all health care and wellness service providers to submit health information to a health information exchange, to be operated and maintained by a state designated entity, for the purposes of facilitating the use and movement of health information among organizations.

HB1107 RELATING TO COMPUTER CRIME.

JHA

Adds aggravated harassment by stalking to the list of offenses upon which the offense of use of a computer in the commission of a separate crime may be based. Specifies that property used in computer crimes shall be forfeited even when the perpetrator was a person under the age of 18 who did not have ownership of the property.

HB1108 RELATING TO GIFTS.

GVR, JHA, FIN

Authorizes legislators and legislative employees to accept gifts of aloha from lobbyists or their clients. Defines "gifts of aloha" as anything of value, including a meal, whose fair market value is \$25 or less.

HB1109 RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE RULE MAKING.

JHA. FIN

CMV, JHA, FIN

Requires that prior to the adoption or repeal of a rule, electronic notice of the proposed rulemaking be provided to all persons who have made a timely written request of the adopting agency for advance notice of its rulemaking proceedings.

HB1110 RELATING TO THE HAWAII CORRECTIONAL SYSTEM

OVERSIGHT COMMISSION.

Appropriates funds for an oversight coordinator position and necessary staff support positions for the Hawaii correctional

system oversight commission.

## REFERRAL HB1111 RELATING TO CRIMINAL PRETRIAL REFORM. JHA. FIN Eliminates the use of monetary bail and requires defendants to be released on their own recognizance for traffic offenses, violations, and nonviolent petty misdemeanor and misdemeanor offenses, with certain exceptions. Creates rebuttable presumptions regarding release and detention for certain offenses and specifies circumstances in which these presumptions apply. HB1112 RELATING TO THE VENDING FACILITIES PROGRAM. HHH, CPC, FIN Allows persons with a mental illness to participate in the vending facilities program. Limits vending facilities owned or operated by persons with mental health disorders to only those state or county public buildings not currently occupied by blind or visually handicapped vendors. RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS. HB1113 HHH. FIN Repeals or reclassifies certain non-general funds administered by the department of human services as recommended by the auditor in auditor report no. 21-02. RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS. HSG, FIN HB1114 Repeals or reclassifies certain non-general funds of the Hawaii public housing authority pursuant to the recommendations of the auditor in auditor report no. 21-02. HB1115 RELATING TO THE STATE FUNDS. JHA. FIN Provides for the deposit into the emergency and budget reserve fund of moneys received by the State through a civil action in which the State is a party and no other law or court order specifically provides for the deposit elsewhere of moneys received through the action. **HB1116** RELATING TO TAX CONFORMITY. **FIN** Requires the State to conform to those provisions of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 relating to taxable income and deductible expenses. HB1117 RELATING TO VACANCIES. JHA, FIN Requires vacancies in the offices of United States Senator, State Senator, and State Representative to be filled by special election. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING. HB1118 GVR, JHA Amends the definition of noncandidate committee and the contents required in noncandidate committee reports filed with the campaign spending commission.

HB1119 RELATING TO CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS.

FIN

FIN

Clarifies that social welfare organizations granted tax exempt status under 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code are subject to the same requirements of other charitable organizations that solicit funds from the public.

HB1120 RELATING TO TELEHEALTH.

HHH, CPC, FIN

Allows for standard telephone contacts for telehealth purposes.

HB1121 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-THIRD REPRESENTATIVE

DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the forty-third representative district.

HB1122 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION

WAL, JHA, FIN

ACT.

Defines "beneficiary consultation". Prohibits the department of Hawaiian home lands from disposing or extending a general lease to non-beneficiaries, unless there are no applicants seeking to enter into a general lease to the use and occupancy of a tract of Hawaiian home lands. Requires the department to notify beneficiaries through beneficiary consultation prior to the disposition of Hawaiian home lands. Adds language to require Section 204 lessees mandate Homestead Beneficiary Agreements. Prohibits the department from establishing additional criteria to enter into a general lease with an applicant, under certain conditions. Specifies that the department may grant a license or enter into a general lease, under certain conditions. Allocates the interest or other earnings from the Hawaiian home loan fund and Hawaiian home general loan fund into their respective funds, under certain conditions. Requires the department to submit a quarterly report to the legislature and beneficiaries. Authorizes the department to negotiate with homestead association governed water agencies to maintain water systems prior to other service providers, under certain conditions.

# HB1123 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

JHA. FIN

Requires that a majority of the members of the Hawaiian Homes Commission be beneficiaries and on the waitlist. Requires quarterly reporting to the legislature and beneficiaries on land dispositions made during the quarter. Authorizes the governor to establish an inter-agency council. Requires a full accounting of Act 14, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 1995, expenditures within one year. Allows the Hawaiian Homes Commission to retain separate counsel from the attorney general to provide service to the Commission and beneficiaries. Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study on the implications of creating a position for the director of the department of Hawaiian home lands that is separate from the chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission.

# HB1124 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT.

WAL, JHA, FIN

Amends the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act to require appraisals of improvements to identify the replacement cost or the leasehold market value. Grants authority to DHHL, to authorize second position loans on homestead leases by approved lenders. Requires DHHL to develop and implement a loan servicing manual, subject to commission approval, to standardize loan loss mitigation policies, procedures, and methods. Clarifies that DHHL shall not cancel a lease solely based on a loan default or delinquency unless all loan loss mitigation procedures are exhausted pursuant to the loan services manual.

### HB1125 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

LAT, FIN

Provides appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of bargaining unit (9) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments and Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund costs negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal biennium 2021-2023.

### HB1126 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

LAT, FIN

Provides appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of bargaining unit (13) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments and Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund costs negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal biennium 2021-2023.

HB1127 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

LAT, FIN

Provides appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of bargaining unit (14) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments and Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund costs negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal biennium 2021-2023.

HB1128 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

PDP, JHA, FIN

During a state of emergency or local state of emergency, provides parameters for delegation of powers and scope and duration of suspension of laws. Provides an advise and consent process for an emergency proclamation to extend beyond one hundred twenty days. Provides a legislative means for an emergency proclamation to be terminated.

HB1129 RELATING TO WATER CARRIERS.

TRN, CPC, FIN

Establishes the maritime commission to oversee the regulation of water carriers in the State. Transfers the oversight of water carriers by the public utilities commission to the maritime commission and makes associated conforming amendments. Establishes the maritime commission special fund. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2022.

HB1130 RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT.

TRN/HSG, WAL,

FIN

Requires the office of planning to hire a contractor to, among other things, identify and assess alternative financing, project delivery, and cost recovery mechanisms to recapture the State's upfront investment in transit-oriented development infrastructure. Requires the contractor to consult with representatives of certain government entities. Requires the office of planning to report its findings to the legislature. Appropriates funds.

HB1131 RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL.

CPC, FIN

Requires the state building code council to: consider the impact of building codes and standards on the cost of single- and multifamily homes built in the State when considering whether to adopt a code or standard; and include with its annual written report to the governor a financial impact assessment on each code and standard adopted by the council.

HB1132 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG, FIN

Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to be appropriated into and out of the rental housing revolving fund for construction of phase I of a senior affordable housing project on Hawaii public housing authority property on School street, Oahu.

## Committee REFERRAL HB1133 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR, FIN Establishes 2 new positions on the board of agriculture and specifies that 1 shall be a resident of the island of Molokai and 1 shall be a resident of the island of Lanai. HB1134 RELATING TO PHARMACY AUDITS. HHH, CPC, FIN Establishes procedures for audits of pharmacies conducted by a health care provider, insurance company, third-party payor, sickness insurance provider, mutual benefit society, dental service corporation, health maintenance organization, or any entity that represents such companies or groups. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN HB1135 THE BENEFIT OF THE FOURTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the fourth representative district. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND HB1136 WAL, JHA, FIN NATURAL RESOURCES. Requires the department of land and natural resources, in conjunction with the counties, to develop an invasive species flood control plan to prevent, contain, and mitigate hazardous tree growth impacting streams and waterways. Requires submittal of the plan to the legislature prior to the 2022 regular session. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND HB1137 WAL, JHA, FIN NATURAL RESOURCES. Requires the department of land and natural resources, in conjunction with the county of Hawaii, to develop an invasive species flood control plan to prevent, contain, and mitigate hazardous tree growth impacting streams and waterways in Puna. Requires submittal of the plan to the legislature prior to the 2022 regular session. JHA RELATING TO ABUSE. HB1138 Changes the age for minors who are in the presence of abuse of family or household member offenses from less than fourteen to

less than eighteen years of age.

# HB1139 RELATING TO HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

HSG, FIN

Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to award funds no later than an unspecified number of days after the deadline to file a consolidated application or no later than an unspecified number of days after the filing of a duly submitted consolidated application if no deadline has been established by the corporation.

## <u>HB1140</u> RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Prohibits the issuance of certain new residential multi-family and commercial building application permits and new state building application permits initiated on or after January 1, 2022, unless the building's parking stalls are electric vehicle charger ready. Allows such buildings to implement an electric vehicle energy management system.

### HB1141 RELATING TO ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLES.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires certain rental motor vehicle lessors to expedite the incorporation of one hundred per cent zero-emission vehicles into the lessor's fleet by 7/1/2035. Requires motor vehicle lessors to certify their compliance to the director of commerce and consumer affairs. Beginning 1/1/2022, establishes a rental motor vehicle emissions surcharge tax on certain rental motor vehicles with internal combustion engines.

### HB1142 RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes a surcharge on the sale of high-end gasoline-powered vehicles to fund the installation of electric vehicle charging systems. Establishes electric vehicle charging system subaccount within the public utilities commission special fund. Sunsets 6/30/2030.

## <u>HB1143</u> RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Amends the definition of renewable portfolio standard for electric utility companies to be a percentage of electrical energy generation, rather than sales. Defines a renewable portfolio standard for gas utility companies. Requires gas utility companies to establish renewable energy portfolio standards and provides a means for gas utility companies to achieve the renewable energy portfolio standards.

HB1144 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

WAL, CPC, FIN

Exempts from general excise tax law amounts received from the interisland transportation and related loading and unloading of livestock. Requires the public utilities commission to authorize preferential water carrier service rates by tariff for ratepayers that operate farms or ranches located in any county with a population equal to or less than 500,000.

<u>HB1145</u> RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.

ECD, FIN

Requires that new income tax credits include a 5-year sunset or a gradual reduction.

HB1146 RELATING TO TAXATION.

ECD/HSG, FIN

Extends the period in which a county may adopt a surcharge on state tax, under certain conditions, from 3/31/2019 to 12/31/2021. Authorizes the use of county surcharge revenues for affordable and workforce housing infrastructure.

HB1147 RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET.

FIN

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for fiscal biennium 2021–2023.

<u>HB1148</u> RELATING TO LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

WAL, FIN

Authorizes the board of land and natural resources to adopt, amend, and repeal administrative fee schedules without regard to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Establishes a process for the board to adopt, amend, and repeal administrative fee schedules, including public notice and meeting requirements.

HB1149 RELATING TO LAND USE.

WAL, FIN

Reorganizes and integrates the land use commission within a modified office of planning, which is renamed as the office of planning and sustainable development. Reclassifies the coastal zone management program and statewide sustainability branch as divisions within the office of planning and sustainable development.

<u>HB1150</u> RELATING TO FISHING.

WAL, JHA

Requires the department of land and natural resources to license non-commercial marine fishing along with freshwater fishing, engage in public outreach prior to implementing the combined non-commercial freshwater and marine fishing license, and submit reports to the legislature. Prohibits enforcement of requirement to obtain a license to catch marine life for non-commercial purposes until 6/1/2022.

## <u>HB1151</u> RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, FIN

Requires the agribusiness development corporation to lease agricultural land under its control at the rate of \$1 per year until use of the land has resulted in a profit, at which time an annual supplemental lease rent equivalent to an unspecified percentage of the net profit derived from sales of agricultural products produced on the leased land becomes applicable. Exempts a producer of agricultural products from payment of excise tax on the amounts received from sales of agricultural products produced on the leased land.

#### HB1152 RELATING TO MEDICAL EXAMINERS.

HHH, CPC

Requires the counties to have medical examiners who are licensed physicians and certified anatomic or forensic pathologists. Repeals section providing for coroners.

# <u>HB1153</u> RELATING TO BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AT BARBERS ECD, FIN

POINT.

Authorizes a GET exemption for businesses investing more than \$500,000 over a 10-year period and creating a minimum of 50 job positions for the purpose of business development at Barbers Point in the Kalaeloa opportunity zone. Establishes a tax credit for upgrading infrastructure at Barbers Point.

### HB1154 RELATING TO TOWING.

CPC, JHA

Requires towing companies to release vehicles, without a fee, to an authorized driver if the authorized driver appears at the scene of the towing. Defines "authorized driver."

### HB1155 RELATING TO COFFEE.

AGR, ECD, FIN

Requires and appropriates funds to the department of agriculture to apply to register the term "Kona Coffee Blend" as a geographical indication or a similar intellectual property registration with the United States Patent and Trademark Office. Establishes a surcharge on the sale of certain coffee commodifies to reimburse the general funds appropriated. Requires a roasted coffee or instant coffee to contain at least fifteen per cent coffee by weight from a geographic origin to use that geographic origin in labeling or advertising.

### HB1156 RELATING TO FILM CREDIT CAP REMOVAL.

ECD, FIN

Removes the cap on the amount that may be claimed per qualified production. Removes the limit for the total amount of tax credits allowed per year for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit.

HB1157 RELATING TO AIRFIELDS. TRN, CPC, FIN

Authorizes the department of business, economic development, and tourism to maintain airfields. Requires the department of transportation to transfer the lease of Kawaihapai Airfield to the department of business, economic development, and tourism.

RELATING TO AIRFIELDS. HB1158

TRN, CPC, FIN

Requires the Department of Transportation to allow its lease with the U.S. Department of the Army to expire on its agreed upon termination date and to not terminate the agreement prior to that

date.

RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB1159

EDN, FIN

Requires the department of education to establish and administer a career and technology program that will provide aviation and aviation mechanics education and training to high school

students.

HB1160 RELATING TO AIRFIELDS. TRN, CPC, FIN

Prohibits the eviction of any tenant of Kawaihapai Airfield from being evicted from the airfield until the expiration of the department of transportation and the U.S. Department of the Army's lease, so long as the tenant remains in good standing. Requires the department of transportation to cooperate with any private entity performing an economic feasibility study of Kawaihapai Airfield.

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. HB1161

EDN, FIN

Repeals the state public charter school commission. Transfers the duties of the state public charter school commission to public charter school authorizers. Transfers appropriations from the state public charter school commission to the board of education to be used by public charter school authorizers.

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. HB1162

WAL, JHA, FIN

Authorizes the department of Hawaiian home lands to sell tracts of Hawaiian home lands to native Hawaiians in fee simple. Provides the department with the first right of purchase if a subsequent purchaser of the land is not native Hawaiian.

Prohibits the appointment of state officers and employees to boards and commissions unless otherwise provided.

RELATING TO ESSENTIAL WAGES FOR ESSENTIAL HB1201

WORKERS.

Requires the department of taxation to share information with the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of enforcing the tip credit. Requires the department of taxation to provide an online tool or program to employers to determine compliance with the tip credit. Requires state and county officials, officers, and employees, whenever answering a telephone call, video call, or other form of interactive telecommunication in the performance of their official duties, to identify themselves by first name and offer a polite salutation, consistent with the aloha spirit.

## RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE INVESTING.

ECD, CPC, FIN

Requires a public investment fund to develop, publish, and implement socially responsible investment policies applicable to the management of all public funds under the public investment fund's control and submit an annual report to the legislature on disclosing its investments in accord with environmental, social, and governance investing and socially responsible investment policies.

HB1206

### RELATING TO FOOD SECURITY.

AGR, CPC, FIN

Initiates reporting requirements and safeguards to prevent anticompetitive practices in the meat processing industry.

HB1207

#### RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE.

EEP, FIN

Renames the environmental response, energy, and food security tax the environmental response tax. Repeals the deposit of taxes collected on barrels of petroleum products into the energy security special fund, energy systems development special fund, and agricultural development and food security special fund. Requires all taxes collected on each one million British thermal units of fossil fuels to be deposited into the general fund.

HB1208

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 3 OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION RELATING TO THE FUNCTIONS, POWERS, AND DUTIES OF REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.

ECD, JHA, FIN

Proposes an amendment to the Hawaii State Constitution to repeal the exclusive power of the counties as to the functions, powers, and duties relating to the taxation of real property and authorize the State to also exercise those functions, powers, and duties.

By 1/1/2026, requires the department of taxation to suspend and refunds certain income tax amounts received or withheld upon the enactment of a state law specifying real property tax amounts. Requires procurement officers to complete periodic performance evaluations of certain contractors. Requires past performance to be factored into future bid selection of contractors for certain contracts. Requires past performance to be considered in all sole source procurement and any competitive sealed contracts that exceeds the small purchase threshold. Requires the state procurement office to submit preliminary and final reports to the legislature. Repeals 6/30/2026.

HB1211

### RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

GVR, CPC, FIN

Establishes the subcontractor listing pilot program to be conducted by the department of accounting and general services. Requires a report to the legislature.

HB1212

### RELATING TO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

GVR, CPC, FIN

Establishes the office of public-private partnerships and the position of state public-private partnerships coordinator. Adds design-build-operate-maintain and design-build-finance-operate-maintain project delivery methods to the Procurement Code and related conditions and requirements. Appropriates funds.

## <u>HB1213</u> RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

HSG, JHA, FIN

Requires that Hawaii housing finance and development corporation housing projects, in a county having a population of more than 100,000 but less than 1,000,000, include a restrictive covenant that the percentage of units of the housing project that are designated as affordable housing, as described in the submitted housing project application, shall be affordable housing in perpetuity.

## HB1214 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

GVR, CPC, FIN

Allows a bidder of a public works construction project to clarify and correct certain information regarding subcontractors for up to two hours after bid closing. Mandates a two hour waiting period after bid closing before construction bids can be opened. Prohibits bid shopping and bid peddling for the competitive sealed bidding process. Requires public procurement construction bids to list subcontractors and joint contractors only for contracts with an unspecified total value; provided that bids lacking this list may be accepted if in the State's best interest and the value of the work to be performed by the joint contractor or subcontractor is equal to or less than an unspecified percent of the total bid amount. Repeals 7/1/2023.

## <u>HB1215</u> RELATING TO FEES FOR BIRTH CERTIFICATES.

HHH, FIN

Extends by three years the requirement that the department of health furnish, free of charge, certified copies of birth certificates for any individual who is homeless, provided the individual's homeless status is corroborated by a verification letter issued by a homeless service provider. Repeals June 30, 2024.

### HB1216 RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS.

CPC, FIN

Requires that any budget increases to members of a planned community association be approved by at least sixty per cent of the board membership.

## HB1217 RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS.

CPC, FIN

Prohibits any planned community association from assessing a fine or requiring an architectural review for construction or installation work to the exterior of a member's or tenant's unit if performed more than three or more years ago or if performed by a previous member of tenant of the unit, regardless of when the previous member or tenant performed the construction or installation work on the unit.

Removes the construction completion deadline for the Leialii affordable housing project and Keawe Street Apartments. Exempts the project from the application of Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that the project gives preference to Lahaina residents in its tenant placement policy.

### HB1312 RELATING TO INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.

HET, CPC, FIN

Requires the university of Hawaii to include in certain employment agreements that address intellectual property rights a condition requiring the employees to make a good faith effort to sell or license intellectual property to a farmer or agricultural producer within the State prior to attempting to sell or license the intellection property to an entity outside of the State.

### HB1313 RELATING TO THE STATE FUEL TAX.

CPC. FIN

Changes the assessment of the state fuel tax from a specified cents per gallon to the greater of a specified cents per gallon or a specified percentage of the wholesale price per gallon to the retailer, subject to a minimum monetary amount of tax based upon the tax paid by certain retailers. Effective 7/1/2023.

## <u>HB1314</u> RELATING TO TAXATION.

ECD, JHA, FIN

Authorizes each county to levy a county surcharge on transient accommodations tax if the county satisfies certain real property tax requirements. Repeals the allocation of transient accommodations tax revenue to the counties and makes conforming amendments. Establishes a residential property owner tax credit and a residential circuit breaker tax credit. Beginning with taxable years after 12/31/2021, gradually implements new individual income tax and corporation income tax brackets and rates in three-year intervals.

HB1316 RELATING TO PACKAGING WASTE.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires producers of packaging waste be responsible for the end-of-life management of their products in a way that ensures minimal social and environmental impacts. Allows the department of health to administratively impose civil penalties.

Establishes the waste and litter management special fund.

HB1317 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Allows county governments to enter into private-public partnerships for the services and transferring, or joint venturing of one or more of their wastewater treatment facilities to a private entity, or its wholly owned nonprofit management entity,

for the delivery of those services.

HB1318 RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

EEP, FIN

Restructures the statewide sustainability branch as the sustainability and environmental review division. Transfers the environmental council from the department of health to be established in the office of planning as the environmental advisory council. Transfers the rights, powers, employees, appropriations, and other personal property from the office of environmental quality control to the sustainability and environmental review division. Amends the ability for an applicant to appeal nonacceptance of an environmental impact statement from the environmental council to the environmental

advisory council.

HB1319 RELATING TO CARBON PRICING.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Amends the environmental response, energy, and food security tax to address carbon emissions. Increases the tax rate to effectively set a price of \$40 per metric ton of carbon dioxide emissions in 2022. Incrementally increases the tax rate over time so that, in 2032, the tax rate shall be equivalent to a carbon price of \$80 per metric ton of carbon emissions. Establishes a refundable tax credit to mitigate the effect of a carbon emissions tax on taxpayers. Takes effect 1/1/2022. Tax credit applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2021.

HB1320 RELATING TO ABANDONED AND DERELICT VEHICLES. TRN, JHA, FIN Establishes the abandoned and derelict vehicles task force to make recommendations to ensure the proper identification and disposal of abandoned and derelict vehicles left on the State's highways. Appropriates moneys for the administration and operation of the abandoned and derelict vehicles task force. RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TRN, FIN HB1321 Requires the posting of depth gauge signs, in a manner consistent with the Federal Highway Administration's Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, on any portion of a public highway that lies within a special flood hazard area and is prone to flooding. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE. HB1322 HHH, CPC, FIN Establishes a trauma-informed care task force within the department of health to make recommendations of traumainformed care in the State. HB1323 RELATING TO COMMON INTEREST AGRICULTURAL AGR, CPC, FIN COMMUNITIES. Establishes a regulatory structure for common interest agricultural communities on lands classified as agricultural. Specifies requirements for development, creation, registration, governance, and management of common interest agricultural communities. Requires county approval of proposed common interest agricultural community projects. Prohibits approval for condominium property regimes created under chapter 514B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, on lands classified as agricultural. RELATING TO COMMERCIAL PROPERTY RENT RELIEF. HB1324 PDP/ECD, CPC, Establishes a commercial rent relief grant program. Requires **FIN** that the commercial rent relief grants be given priority for moneys received through federal funding. Appropriated funds. RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. HB1325 GVR, CPC, FIN Requires public contractors to obtain insurance to cover at least half of a project's construction costs to the State, to provide funds for curing construction defects discovered within five years after the completion of the contract. Authorizes the State to institute an action against the contractor for the total costs of curing those defects.

# <u>HB1326</u> RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

JHA

Allows a narrow hearsay exception for statements made by domestic violence victims to certain government officials within 24 hours of an incident of domestic violence and prior to the arrest of the defendant, even if the statement is testimonial in nature, as long as the statement bears sufficient indicia of reliability.

### HB1327 RELATING TO THE YOUTH VAPING EPIDEMIC.

HHH, CPC, FIN

Bans the sale of flavored tobacco products. Prohibits mislabeling of e-liquid products containing nicotine. Establishes fines and penalties for violations. Includes heated tobacco products among the electronic smoking devices that are subject to restrictions under law.

#### HB1328 RELATING TO ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES.

HHH, CPC, FIN

Makes unlawful the sale of flavored products for electronic smoking devices, mislabeling of e-liquid products containing nicotine, and sale of tobacco products other than through retail sales via in-person exchange. Establishes penalties. Includes eliquid and electronic smoking devices in the definition of "tobacco products" for purposes of the cigarette tax and tobacco tax law. Increases the license fee for wholesalers and dealers of tobacco products and retail tobacco permit fee. Requires retailers to pay an additional excise tax on the retail price of electronic smoking devices on and after 7/1/2021. Directs a certain percentage of moneys received from the cigarette tax and tobacco tax to the Hawaii tobacco prevention and control trust fund to establish and fund a comprehensive youth tobacco cessation program. Requires a person under twenty-one years of age who unlawfully purchases or possesses tobacco products, including electronic smoking devices, to complete a tobacco education or use cessation program or perform community service for a first offense. Repeals the electronic smoking device retailer registration unit. Repeals provisions relating to delivery of sales under the cigarette tax and tobacco tax law.

### HB1329 RELATING TO ELECTRONIC SMOKING PRODUCTS.

HHH, CPC, FIN

Includes e-liquid and electronic smoking devices within the definition of "tobacco products", as used in the cigarette tax and tobacco tax law. Repeals certain provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes relating to electronic smoking devices.

EDN, FIN

HB1330 WAL, JHA, FIN Amends the definition of "historic property" to mean a building, structure, object, district, area, or site that is over 100 years old. Limits the applicability of section 6E-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which requires review of certain proposed projects, to privately-owned single-family detached dwelling units and townhouses that are over 100 years old and meet other statutory criteria. RELATING TO FIREWORKS. HB1331 TRN, CPC, FIN Requires the harbors division of the department of transportation to inspect shipments landing at a commercial harbor within the division's jurisdiction and originating from a geographic location that is known to manufacture, use, or export aerial fireworks. #### HB1345 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND

NATURAL RESOURCES.

Requires the department of land and natural resources to purchase within its existing budget an Infrared Unit B2-FO for the Maui branch of the division of forestry and wildlife for game management and collecting and tracking accurate herd counts.

#### HB1346 RELATING TO FOOD SUSTAINABILITY.

WAL, FIN

WAL, FIN

Requires the department of agriculture, in coordination with the appropriate departmental agency, to prepare and periodically update a functional plan for seafood sustainability that expands the State's priority on food by including wild seafood as a viable

food source.

#### HB1347 RELATING TO THE ALOHA STADIUM.

WAL, CPC/JHA, **FIN** 

Provides development guidance policies for the stadium authority. Tasks the authority with seeking to promote the safety and reliability of harbor infrastructure by identifying and developing appropriate areas within the stadium development district, including stadium parking lots as appropriate, that are fortified to withstand the structural requirements of a permanent shipping container storage and lay down facility for emergency use by Pearl Harbor.

FIN

HB1348 RELATING TO THE STADIUM DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. WAL, CPC/JHA,

Establishes the stadium development district special fund. Revises the general development guidance policies for the stadium development district and clarifies the respective roles the stadium authority and Hawaii community development authority in the development of the stadium development district. Broadens the powers and duties of the stadium authority, including authorizing the stadium authority to acquire and hold title to real property. Exempts land to which the stadium authority holds title from the definition of "public lands." Authorizes the Hawaii community development authority, with approval from the governor, to delegate to other state agencies implementation of capital improvement projects, under certain conditions. Broadens the representation of the stadium authority by adding two members to its membership. Amends the general bond authorization made by Act 268, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019. Makes the financial disclosures of members of the stadium authority public records pursuant to section 84-17(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

HB1349 RELATING TO STATEWIDE COMPOSTING.

EEP, HHH, FIN

Requires the department of health to establish a multi-tiered registration and permitting system for all classes of solid waste composting facilities. Requires the department of health to update its co composting rules by 1/1/2023, and every ten years thereafter. Permits composting and co-composting operations in agricultural districts.

HB1350 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, JHA, FIN

Requires the environmental council to develop a tool to identify economic justice communities. Defines "economic justice community". Appropriates moneys.

<u>HB1351</u> RELATING TO CONSERVATION MITIGATION BANKS.

WAL, FIN

Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to establish and operate conservation mitigation banks to restore, create, enhance, or preserve conservation habitats or resources as compensatory mitigation. Authorizes the department to contract a third-party administrator for the operation of the mitigation banks.

HB1352 RELATING TO SURPLUS MILITARY LAND.

CMV, WAL, FIN

Establishes a surplus military land task force to plan for the remediation and restoration of, and alternative uses for, lands currently under federal ownership and control that are anticipated to be returned to the State.

# <u>HB1353</u> RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

WAL, CPC, FIN

Establishes a process for landowners whose real property is at risk of reasonably foreseeable flooding or whose real property has experienced a flood due to man-made alterations or natural conditions on state lands to petition the department of land and natural resources for a flood mitigation action plan. Authorizes landowners to undertake improvements to the state lands if substantial progress is not made within a certain amount of time.

### HB1354 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR

FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-FOURTH

REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the fortyfourth representative district.

#### HB1355 RELATING TO STATE PROCUREMENT REFORM.

GVR, CPC, FIN

Requires procurement officers to document whether to pursue a design professional for damages in the event of construction cost overruns. Requires the chief procurement officer to compile a public list of construction companies or design professionals that are in noncompliance with the procurement code or owe penalties. Requires the state procurement office include training on the duty of procurement officers to hold design professionals liable for breaches of professional standards. Requires the legislative reference bureau to conduct a study on the laws and regulations relating to construction management policies and procedures applicable to the procurement code.

### HB1356 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, JHA, FIN

Clarifies that "customary and traditional subsistence farming", which is customary and traditional subsistence farming conducted by a native Hawaiian cultural practitioner in certain situations, is included as a protected activity under the Hawaii Right to Farm Act. Clarifies that the cultivation of crops and activities related to game, fish, and livestock on agricultural lands may be for economic use or customary and traditional subsistence farming. Provides that one of the State's policies under the Hawaii State Planning Act's agricultural objectives is to assure the right of native Hawaiian cultural practitioners to engage in customary and traditional subsistence farming for direct personal or family consumption. Effective 7/1/2060.

HB1357 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

CAI, JHA, FIN

Requires the governor, lieutenant governor, state legislators, and heads of principal departments to prominently display a Hawaiian translation of the name of their office or department at least once on the main page of their official website and in the letterhead of their stationery.

HB1358 RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

CAI, JHA, FIN

Defines "pre-contact historic property". Clarifies that the historic preservation program includes providing consultation to counties and public and private agencies involved in historic preservation and the development, publication, and distribution of materials about protections for burials, historic sites, and archaeological resources. Amends the composition and duties of the Hawaii historic places review board. Increases civil and administrative fines for certain violations of historic and preservation requirements and makes violators liable for costs associated with mitigation or restoration measures.

HB1359 RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION.

HHH, HET, FIN

Establishes the cannabinoid medicine program within the school of medicine of the university of Hawaii.

<u>HB1360</u> RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING.

EDN, FIN

Establishes an early childhood educator stipend program to be administered by the executive office on early learning to address the shortage of qualified early childhood educators in Hawaii. Requires stipend fund repayments for the early childhood educator stipend program to be deposited into the early learning special fund.

HB1361 RELATING TO FIRE SAFETY.

LAT, FIN

Establishes a working group to determine if a full-time state fire marshal's office would be more effective than the existing state fire council in planning, executing, and promoting fire safety-related programs and topics in the State. Requires the working group to submit a report to the legislature prior to the regular session of 2022.

HB1362 RELATING TO ACCESS TO LEARNING.

EDN, FIN

Establishes the Hawaii early childhood educator stipend program to address shortage of early childhood education educators. Extends certain effective dates for implementation of Act 46, SLH 2020. Requires the application of a uniform assessment for public and charter school kindergarten students. Allows educational data to be shared using an existing system. Appropriates funds.

# <u>HB1363</u> RELATING TO SHORELINES.

WAL, CPC, FIN

Authorizes the board of land and natural resources to provide shoreline encroachment easements that do not exceed 10 years to landowners having structures that encroach on the shoreline. Requires the board of land and natural resources to adopt rules that establish a policy and procedure for the granting or renewal of shoreline encroachment easements. Requires the adopted policy to consider the impact of expected sea level rise on the encroaching structures. Prohibits the granting of any new shoreline encroachment easements until the new policy is adopted.

#### HB1364 RELATING TO HEMP.

AGR, FIN

Reduces from 500 feet to 100 feet the buffer zones for commercial hemp production and processing. Authorizes hemp to be grown at a residential property under the control of a person licensed under federal law to produce hemp. Repeals authorization from the state department of agriculture as a prerequisite to transport hemp. Authorizes commercial hemp producers to sell whole, unprocessed hemp leaves to consumers, subject to certain requirements. Requires labels that disclose that leaves and hemp products were from hemp grown in the State. Replaces the referenced testing standard authority on labels for hemp products.

### HB1365 RELATING TO MARINE LIFE.

WAL, CPC

Requires persons applying for a commercial marine license to appear in person before DLNR. Prohibits DLNR from issuing or renewing a commercial marine license to an alien crew member who has not been granted permission to land temporarily by federal law. Requires a DLNR permit for black coral taken within the jurisdiction of the State for commercial purposes.

## <u>HB1366</u> RELATING TO FIREARMS.

JHA, FIN

Amends the class C felony offense of manufacturing, purchasing, or obtaining firearm parts to assemble a firearm having no serial number to also prohibit possession of those firearm parts. Amends Act 74, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, to repeal language that specified the prospective application of that Act. Applies retroactively to 9/15/2020.

HB1367 RELATING TO THE STATE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL EDN, JHA COMMISSION. Amends the appointing authority of the public charter school commission members. Specifies the transition from existing members to members appointed under the new appointing authority. Requires that members of the public charter school commission possess strong experience and expertise in public and nonprofit governance, management and finance, public school leadership, assessment, curriculum, instruction, and public education law. RELATING TO FILM CREDIT CAP REMOVAL. HB1368 ECD. FIN Removes the cap on the amount that may be claimed per qualified production. Removes the limit for the total amount of tax credits allowed per year for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit. Deducts a percentage to be utilized for motion picture, digital media, and film education development in the State. HB1369 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-FIFTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 45th Representative District. RELATING TO AN AIRFIELD AUTHORITY. HB1370 TRN, CPC, FIN Establishes an independent authority to be called the Kawaihapai Airfield Authority. The intent of this authority is to allow continued use of Kawaihapai airfield for private and commercial use by the state's residents and tourists. RELATING TO ENERGY USE. HB1371 EEP, CPC, FIN Requires the state energy office to conduct a study the adequacy of renewable energy infrastructure in Hawaii. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO AIRPORTS. HB1372 TRN, CPC, FIN Allows any county to operate or maintain an airport or airfield. RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT. HB1373 WAL, CPC, FIN Establishes the Hawaii beach preservation revolving fund within the state treasury. actuarial study. Appropriates funds for the study.
