RELATING TO HOUSING.

Establishes the ALOHA homes program to develop low-cost homes on state-owned and county-owned land in urban redevelopment sites to be sold in leasehold by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation (HHFDC) to qualified residents. Exempts certain land from the definition of public lands. Requires HHFDC to gain legislative approval before disposing of certain lands. Provides for the disposition of lands acquired by HHFDC but no longer needed for the ALOHA homes program. Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

<u>SB2, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Clarifies that lands set aside to the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation by the governor or leased to the corporation by other state departments and agencies are exempt from the definition of "public lands". Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to dispose of public lands pursuant to chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Clarifies that lands set aside by the governor or leased to the Hawaii housing finance development corporation from other state agencies are subject to legislative approval prior to the sale or gift of those lands. <u>SB4, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO INCLUSIONARY ZONING. Prohibits any law, ordinance, or rule from imposing an inclusionary zoning requirement on housing offered exclusively for sale in perpetuity to buyers who are residents of the State, are owner-occupants, and do not own any other real property. Requires each county to submit a report on inclusionary zoning requirements to the legislature every year until the regular session of 2026. Takes effect 5/6/2137. (SD2)</p>	WAL, CPC, FIN
<u>SB7, SD1</u>	<p>RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Authorizes the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation the right of first refusal for the development of property for all development on state lands, excluding Hawaii Public Housing Authority and Department of Hawaiian Home Land lands, that are within a one-half mile radius of a rail transit station provided there is a transfer of any property interest, including a leasehold interest, of state lands that are within a one-half mile radius of a rail transit station. <u>SB12, SD1</u>	<p>RELATING TO HOUSING OBJECTIVES. Requires the Hawaii public housing authority and the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to accomplish certain housing objectives. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	HSG, FIN
<u>SB23, SD1</u>	<p>RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL INDUSTRY. Repeals vehicle license recovery fees. Takes effect 1/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	TRN, CPC, FIN

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<u>SB25, SD2</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS. Permits minors to consent to medical care related to the diagnosis or treatment of HIV or the prevention of HIV. Provides that a minor, under certain circumstances, shall not be liable for payment for treatment or prevention of HIV. Authorizes physician assistants, in addition to physicians and advanced practice registered nurses, to render medical care and services to minors. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD2)	HHH, JHA, FIN
<u>SB32, SD1</u>	RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE. Requires public utilities to consider the disruption to transportation as a criterion in planning future maintenance. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	TRN, CPC, FIN
<u>SB35, SD1</u>	RELATING TO THE RESIDENTIAL LANDLORD-TENANT CODE. Prohibits landlords from recovering possession of a dwelling unit from tenants if habitability of the premises is significantly impaired. Sets a tenant's liability for rent if habitability of the premises is significantly impaired. Provides remedies for retaliatory evictions. Effective 7/1/2124. (SD1)	CPC, JHA
<u>SB36, SD2</u>	RELATING TO RENTAL DISCRIMINATION. Prohibits discrimination, including in advertisements for available real property, based on participation in a housing assistance program, or requirements related to participation in housing assistance programs, in rental transactions and requirements. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD2)	HSG, JHA, FIN
<u>SB40, SD2</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Exempts from income restrictions for-sale housing projects that are built for qualified residents, who will be owner-occupants in perpetuity, and who own no other property. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD2)	HSG, CPC, FIN
<u>SB56, SD1</u>	RELATING TO REVENUE GENERATION. Increases the personal income tax rate for high earners for taxable years beginning after 12/31/2020. Increases the tax on capital gains. Increases the corporate income tax and establishes a single corporate income tax rate. From 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2023, temporarily repeals certain general excise tax exemptions. Increases conveyance taxes for the sale of properties valued at \$4,000,000 or greater. (SD1)	ECD, HSG, CPC, FIN

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<u>SB57, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO VEHICLE INSPECTIONS. Codifies certain certification, renewal, and violation processes of vehicle inspectors who conduct vehicle safety inspections under the department of transportation. Repeals requirement for reconstructed vehicles to obtain a special inspection and certification. Effective 7/1/2040. (SD2)</p>	TRN, JHA, FIN
<u>SB82, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATION AND POLICY. Requires each new member of a board or commission to participate in an orientation and training session with the head of the department with jurisdiction of that member's board or commission or their designee. Requires each department and agency to train their members at least once per calendar year. (SD2)</p>	GVR, CPC, FIN
<u>SB86, SD3</u>	<p>RELATING TO HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Requires the Department of Health to issue medical cannabis dispensary licenses to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, allowing for increased revenue for beneficiaries. Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to study the feasibility and revenue to be generated by medical cannabis dispensaries, limited gaming, and other potential revenue-generating options on Hawaiian home lands. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD3)</p>	HHH, JHA, CPC, FIN
<u>SB112, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Makes flying or facilitating flying without a pilot license a misdemeanor. Defines pilot license. Takes effect 1/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	TRN, JHA, CPC
<u>SB132, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO WATER POLLUTION. Beginning January 1, 2023, bans the sale, offer of sale, or distribution in the State of any sunscreen that contains avobenzone or octocrylene, or both, without a prescription issued by a licensed healthcare provider to preserve marine ecosystems. (SD2)</p>	EEP/WAL, CPC, FIN
<u>SB135, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATION. Requires the office of enterprise technology services to establish a working group and conduct a study to identify state office buildings that can provide equitable telecommunication access to allow residents of the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui, and rural areas of the city and county of Honolulu, including residents with disabilities, to participate remotely in legislative hearings. Requires a report to the legislature. Provides that the working group shall be dissolved on an unspecified date. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	HET, JHA, FIN

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<u>SB136, SD1</u>	<p>RELATING TO THE SCHOOL FACILITIES AGENCY. Requires the department of education school facilities agency to adopt and publish administrative rules necessary to implement Act 72, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, by July 1, 2021. Requires the office of the governor to provide a report to the legislature regarding the process by which the department of education purchases land and executes capital improvement project contracts through the school facilities agency. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	EDN, FIN
<u>SB137, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO LAND USE. Authorizes county land use decision—making authorities to amend district boundaries involving certain land areas greater than fifteen acres, but not more than twenty-five acres, if the land areas are proposed for reclassification to the urban district, contiguous to an urban district, and at least sixty per cent of the land areas will be dedicated for the development of affordable housing. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	WAL/HSG, CPC, FIN
<u>SB140, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT. Requires the Hawaii community development authority to develop a transit-oriented development zone improvement program. Authorizes the Hawaii community development authority to establish transit-oriented development zones for certain state lands within a one-half mile radius around fixed transit stations. Appropriates funds to the Hawaii community development authority for staff necessary to develop and manage the transit-oriented development zone improvement program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	TRN/HSG, WAL, FIN
<u>SB141, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL. Transfers the State Building Code Council from the Department of Accounting and General Services to the Hawaii State Energy Office. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>SB142, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO HOUSING DEVELOPMENT. Exempts affordable housing units, additions to existing dwelling units, accessory dwelling units, ohana dwelling units, and affordable housing projects developed by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority from school impact fee requirements. (SD2)</p>	HSG, FIN

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<u>SB153, SD2</u>	RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. Establishes penalties for violations of the ignition interlock device law. Requires proof of compliance with the ignition interlock device law to be eligible to apply for a driver's license. Requires the Department of Transportation to provide ignition interlock device installation and services to qualifying individuals at no cost. Doubles the revocation period for those who do not own a vehicle in which to place an ignition interlock device. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD2)	CPC, JHA
<u>SB159, SD1</u>	RELATING TO VOTING. Requires any person who is eligible to vote and applies for a motor vehicle driver's license or identification card to be automatically registered to vote unless the applicant affirmatively declines. Prohibits the Examiner of Drivers from transmitting information if the applicant presents a document demonstrating a lack of United States Citizenship. Authorizes access to and electronic transmission of databases maintained or operated by the counties or the department of transportation that contains driver's license or identification card information to election officials and the online voter registration system. <u>SB163, SD1</u>	RELATING TO CHILDHOOD SEXUAL ABUSE. Amends statutory limitations on the time period in which a survivor of childhood sexual abuse may file a civil suit. Allows punitive damages. Permits the court to order restorative justice measures at its discretion, if requested by the victim. (SD1)	HHH, JHA, FIN
<u>SB167, SD1</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE PLAN. Establishes green infrastructure objectives and policies for state facility systems in the Hawaii State Planning Act to improve the quality of life for residents and visitors. Adds definition of "green infrastructure". Requires the office of planning, in partnership with the greenhouse gas sequestration task force, to submit a report to the legislature making recommendations for implementing the green infrastructure objectives, policies, and priority guidelines established by this measure. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	GVR, EEP, FIN
<u>SB176, SD1</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Provides that each industrial park lease shall include a rent escalation clause that specifies that increases in rental rates for a 5-year period shall not exceed the lower of the percentage specified in the Consumer Price Index or 10%. Authorizes the Board of Land and Natural Resources to sell parcels of Sand Island Industrial Park to a lessee under a master lease. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	WAL, CPC, JHA, FIN

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<u>SB178, SD2</u>	RELATING TO DRIVING ON BEACHES. Establishes a two-year beach protection pilot program under which no vehicles are authorized to drive on the beach in Polihale state park without a permit. Requires a report to the legislature. Effective 5/6/2137. Repeals on 6/30/2023. (SD2)	WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>SB180, SD1</u>	RELATING TO DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINERS. Exempts a beverage dealer who is in a high-density population area from operating a redemption center if the dealer is located within one mile of a certified redemption center operated independently of the dealer. Requires the department of health to annually adjust the handling fees for the deposit beverage container program to an amount not less than the handling fee in the prior calendar year as adjusted by percentage changes in the Consumer Price Index for the Honolulu area. Takes effect on 7/1/2024. (SD1)	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>SB189, SD1</u>	RELATING TO DOG BITES. Removes the requirement to prove that the dog has bitten on two separate occasions for dog bite victims to bring legal action against a dog's owner. (SD1)	JHA, FIN
<u>SB191, SD2</u>	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Provides a process for associations to incorporate power of sale language into governing documents. Clarifies the legislative intent that the explicit grant of power of sale to associations is not required for the purposes of enforcing association liens under the association alternate power of sale foreclosure process. (SD2)	CPC, JHA
<u>SB192, SD1</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC ASSISTANCE. Allows the Department of Human Services to administer and provide public assistance to eligible residents of the State during a governor-declared state of emergency. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	PDP/HHH, JHA, FIN
<u>SB199, SD2</u>	RELATING TO ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT. Mandates appointment of a guardian ad litem to represent the best interest of a mentally ill individual in assistant community treatment proceedings. Eliminates the need for the office of the public defender to participate in the proceedings. Effective 5/1/2029. (SD2)	HHH, JHA, FIN
<u>SB219, SD2</u>	RELATING TO CRIMES ON AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Imposes extended terms of imprisonment for certain offenses against property rights negligently committed on agricultural lands. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD2)	AGR, JHA, FIN

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<u>SB221, SD1</u>	RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Allows the governor's coordinator on homelessness, in conjunction with the Hawaii interagency council on homelessness, to develop plans for the City and County of Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui to coordinate the services and shelter facilities of public agencies and nonprofit organizations to meet the concerns of communities impacted by homelessness and the needs of the homeless population within each county. Effective 5/1/2029. (SD1)	HHH, JHA, FIN
<u>SB222, SD1</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES. Requires the Comptroller's annual report to the Governor and to the Legislature to include a list of all accounts that were closed by the Comptroller during the immediately preceding fiscal year, and a list of accounts that remain open but that are serving a lapsed program or initiative. (SD1)	GVR, FIN
<u>SB226, SD1</u>	RELATING TO LAND EXCHANGE. Allows the governor to negotiate land exchanges to acquire lands suitable for long-term diversified agricultural production in return for state lands to be developed for affordable, workforce, and other housing. Requires legislative approval for the land exchanges. Report to the Legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR/HSG, WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>SB229, SD1</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF THE AUDITOR. Requires departments to submit their annual reports concerning their non-general fund accounts to the Auditor in addition to the Legislature. Requires departments to include the status of implementing any recommendations made by the Auditor, and if no action has been taken, to detail the reasons why any recommendation has not been implemented in their annual reports submitted regarding their non-general fund accounts. Requires the Auditor to include, in its annual report to the Legislature on special, revolving, and trust funds, identification of any unimplemented fund recommendations made in an earlier auditor's report. <u>SB232</u>	RELATING TO LITTERING. Increases the maximum civil penalty for littering from \$500 to \$1,000. Increases the maximum fine for the offense of criminal littering from \$1,000 to \$5,000.	JHA, FIN

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SB238, SD2	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Amends ballot requirements to display candidates for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs Board of Trustees, by residency and non-residency requirements and to randomize the order of candidate names within those groupings. (SD2)	JHA, FIN
SB241, SD1	RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS. Authorizes qualifying patients and qualifying out-of-state patients to transport cannabis between islands of the State for personal medical use. Effective 5/6/2137. (SD1)	HHH/TRN, JHA, CPC
SB243, SD2	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Requires the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute to develop a strategic plan that outlines benchmarks to achieve a 100% renewable energy portfolio standard and to submit the strategic plan to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023. Requires the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute to conduct a feasibility study on the State's ability to achieve its renewable energy goals by 2045 and to submit its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EEP, CPC, FIN
SB244, SD2	RELATING TO FOOD DONATION. Expands liability protection for donors to include donations of food and similar donations made to needy persons by organizations. Authorizes the donation of expired food when the donor reasonably believes in good faith that the food remains fit for human consumption. (SD2)	JHA, CPC
SB245, SD1	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the department of education's existing Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) working group to create a state plan to make completion of the FAFSA or an opt-out waiver a statewide graduation requirement by the 2023-2024 school year. Requires a report to the 2022 Legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EDN/HET, FIN
SB246, SD1	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. Establishes a state government realignment commission to periodically review the state executive branch's departments, divisions, and agencies, including functions and services, and submit its findings and recommendations to the Legislature. (SD1)	GVR, CPC, FIN

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<u>SB251, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES.</p> <p>Establishes requirements and permitting procedures for transportation network companies operating in the State. Makes permanent insurance requirements for transportation network companies and transportation network drivers. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	CPC, FIN
<u>SB255, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO COMMERCIAL MARINE LICENSES.</p> <p>Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to establish rules and fees for the issuance of a commercial marine vessel license. Provides that a single valid commercial marine vessel license satisfies the licensure requirement for all persons aboard the licensed vessel. Requires any person who provides fishing charter services to obtain a commercial marine license. Allows marine charter fishing vessels to obtain commercial marine vessel licenses. Requires the department of land and natural resources to submit a report to the legislature regarding the status of its administrative rules establishing a new commercial marine vessel license category. <u>SB257, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO LEASE EXTENSIONS ON PUBLIC LAND.</p> <p>Requires the board of land and natural resources to establish a public lands lease extension pilot project to extend certain leases of public lands for commercial, industrial, resort, mixed-use, or government use upon approval of a proposed development agreement to make substantial improvements to the existing improvements. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	WAL, JHA, CPC, FIN
<u>SB262, SD1</u>	<p>RELATING TO VACCINES.</p> <p>Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2051. (SD1)</p>	PDP, FIN
<u>SB263, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.</p> <p>Transfers oversight of the "Made in Hawaii" program as it relates to manufactured products to the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Places the "Grown in Hawaii with Aloha" program under the management of the department of agriculture. Transfers ownership of the "Made in Hawaii with Aloha" trademark from the department of agriculture to the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Appropriates funds the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	ECD/AGR, CPC, FIN
<u>SB266, SD2</u>	<p>RELATING TO THE CORONAVIRUS 2019 PANDEMIC.</p> <p>Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p>	PDP, FIN

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Appropriates elementary and secondary school emergency relief fund (ESSER funds) moneys received by the State from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 2020, Public Law 116-136, and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021, Public Law 116-260, to offset any budget reductions that are identified or proposed by the department of education and the governor that would result in the reduction of personnel who are subject to a collective bargaining agreement pursuant to chapter 89, Hawaii Revised statutes, and who are employed at the school level, including any budget reduction that would result in a layoff, furlough, or pay reduction. Requires the board of education and superintendent of education to certify in writing that the board of education, superintendent, and department of education agree to the conditions established by this measure, including that the funds appropriated shall be used only for salaries and wages of officers and employees who are subject to a collective bargaining agreement and are employed at the school level. Provides that moneys from the appropriation shall lapse at the end of the fiscal biennium. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

RELATING TO MARRIAGE OF MINORS.

Requires that in the event that one of the respective parties to a marriage contract is a minor and the other party is more than five years older than the minor, the child protective services unit of the department of human services shall investigate and report to the family court of the circuit in which the minor resides before the marriage is approved. Takes effect 5/6/2137. (SD2)

RELATING TO VISION ZERO.

Requires the department of transportation and the counties to implement a vision zero program in Hawaii by 7/1/2022. Establishes a goal of no traffic fatalities or serious injuries by 2045. (SD2)

Expands the ban on pistols with a detachable magazine with over ten round capacity to any firearm with a detachable magazine with over ten round capacity. (SD1)

RELATING TO CARBON OFFSETS.

Establishes procedures for the department of transportation to assist and enable a person to voluntarily purchase a verified carbon offset for carbon dioxide emissions resulting from the person's air travel to or from an airport in the State. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD2)

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SB307, SD1	<p>RELATING TO FIREARMS. Includes any firearm or rifle with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher except shotguns and muzzle-loading firearms in the list of prohibited weapons. Takes effect 5/6/2137. (SD1)</p>	JHA
SB320	<p>RELATING TO TAX RETURN PREPARERS. Requires each tax return preparer to have a valid preparer tax identification number issued by the Internal Revenue Service and to furnish the preparer's tax identification number on any return or claim for refund if required by DOTAX. Establishes penalties for failure to comply. Provides that tax return preparers shall not be liable for penalties prior to January 1, 2022.</p>	CPC, JHA, FIN
SB321, SD2	<p>RELATING TO INCREASING THE PAYMENT AMOUNT FOR THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS' PRO RATA SHARE OF THE PUBLIC LAND TRUST. Requires agencies that collect receipts for any disposition of the public land trust shall each fiscal quarter transfer to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs twenty per cent of each receipt from the disposition. Returns to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs certain moneys previously claimed as public land trust overpayments to the office. Establishes a public land trust revenues negotiating committee exempted from part I of chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Takes effect 5/6/2137. (SD2)</p>	WAL, JHA, FIN
SB332, SD2	<p>RELATING TO PREAUDIT PAYMENTS. Increases the minimum dollar amount of payments required to be preaudited. Allows, rather than requires, the comptroller to preaudit all proposed payments of expenditures under the threshold dollar amount. (SD2)</p>	GVR, FIN
SB335, SD2	<p>RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Requires the Hawaii department of agriculture and agribusiness development corporation to annually lease at least 50% of land leased or up for lease renewal to operations whose primary business is, or supports, local food production beginning 1/1/2022. Requires the Hawaii department of agriculture and agribusiness development corporation to submit reports to the legislature on leasing activities.
