In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 564 SUBMITTING FOR CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE LEGACY LAND CONSERVATION COMMISSION, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, BERYL BLAICH, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE JUNE 30, 2025

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message (GM) 564 that nominates Beryl Blaich to serve the Legacy Land Conservation Commission (LLCC) for a term to expire June 30, 2025.

Mrs. Blaich resides in the County of Kaua'i and possesses membership in an environmental organization and in a land conservation organization, thus fulfilling the LLCC membership requirements of Sections 173A-2.4(a), -2.4(a)(2), and -2.4(a)(3), Hawai'i Revised Statutes. She was the inaugural chairperson of the County of Kaua'i Public Access, Open Space and Natural Resources Preservation Fund Commission, an initiative that shares purpose and matches funding with the Department's Legacy Land Conservation Program. In that role, she led efforts to the develop and utilize a community-based public input process and to formulate land acquisition priorities and recommendations. When Mrs. Blaich began serving on the LLCC in July 2019, she immediately made strong contributions in carefully reviewing grant applications, efficiently organizing field visits on Kaua'i and elsewhere, and thoroughly analyzing key program issues.

Beryl Blaich's deep commitment, experience, and knowledge enhances the effectiveness of the LLCC. The Department supports GM 564 and requests that this Committee find the nominee qualified for the position and recommend that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination.
