Mr. Lee is a very active member of the WDC serving as Chair of the Performance Measures and Accountability Committee, after serving as Vice Chair for a couple years. This Committee reviews and analyzes the statewide performance measures for the WIOA Title I adult, dislocated worker and youth programs. They monitor the progress of each county's American Job Centers. Under Mr. Lee's leadership, the Committee will be conducting a statewide evaluation of training providers, along with training of training providers, and another evaluation of statewide service providers. As Chair he also serves on the important Executive Committee.

Mr. Lee has also served as a Mayor's appointee to the Oahu Workforce Development Board which allows him to offer valuable county perspective of direct delivery of employment services at the American Job Centers. He has worked with training and development in many industries, including media production, industry-wide skills development, and as a fiduciary Trustee overseeing multi-million dollars in member ERISA funds and apprenticeship training programs.
