### 1 Fiscal Implications: None

Department Testimony: The subject matter of this measure falls within the scope of the Department's Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) whose statutory mandate is to assure a comprehensive statewide behavioral health care system by leveraging and coordinating public, private and community resources. communities, and the Hawaii Prevention Resource Center which offers educational materials and
resources to the general public. CDFH's mission is "to reduce and prevent drug abuse in Hawaii
through awareness, education, and action."

Mr. Tjapkes has extensive experience working with disadvantaged communities and
addressing difficult social issues. He specializes in substance abuse and with disadvantaged
youth. He is an advisory board member of the Hawaii Partnership to Prevent Underage
Drinking; member of the Prevention Workgroup for the Hawaii Opioid Initiative; board member
of the Hawaii Youth Services Network; and a member of the Hawaii Substance Abuse Coalition.

Mr. Tjapkes earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Grand Valley State
University out of Grand Rapids Michigan. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Psychology
from Calvin College, which is also out of Grand Rapids Michigan. He also completed the
Weinberg Fellows Program in 2018.
