My name is Christopher Fernandez, and I am the Executive Officer of the Board of Speech Pathology and Audiology (Board). The Board supports the reappointment of Lorna Hu, M.S., to the Board as a licensee member.

Ms. Hu has held a speech pathologist license in this state since February 27, 1986, and her license is current, valid, and in good standing. Ms. Hu is a highly experienced speech pathologist, and she is currently the lead pediatric speech-language pathologist at Tripler Army Medical Center's neuro-developmental multidisciplinary clinic. Her responsibilities include, but are not limited to, evaluating, diagnosing, and treating a variety of simple and complex pediatric patients in the areas of feeding/swallowing, communication, neuro-developmental disorders, language disorders, and autism.

Ms. Hu gives back to the community and the speech pathology industry through years of volunteerism, such as serving as a mentor and clinical student supervisor for various universities, including the University of Hawaii.
